Friday these 24 hours Commenced with
oct heavy gale from the west and
the 6 heavy sea on ship running E by N
under close reef topsails and fore
sail Amidas Part strong wind and
Long clear weather at 6:30 AM made all
6:45 sail Stead E by E wach employed
on craping down latter Part. Ends
with strong breeze Lat Byols 34.49

Saturday
oct these 24 hours Begins with fish
the 7 gales from the NW ship heading
E by E wach employed on Banden
Room at 6 PM Tuck in sail and
Long Set the wach middle Part fish
6:30 gales and smoky weather at 6:30 AM
made all sail Stead E by E at 8 AM
single Tuck the fore topsail latter
Part fish gales Lat Byols 34.43

Sunday
oct these 24 hours Begins with fish
the 8 gales from the NW ship heading
E by E nothing in sight at 6 PM
Tuck in sail head NW by NW middle
Part light breeze at 6:30 AM made
all sail at 10 AM saw one Night
whale head Starboard just fast west
boat circle at 12 meridian Tuck the
whale long side ends below and long
See 30 els this day

Monday
oct these 24 hours Begins calm and
the 9 a heavy swell at one PM began cutting
at 5 PM finish cutting at 7 PM
Long Tuck in sail and set the wach
6:30 Boyling middle Part strong wind
at 6 AM set double reef fore topsail
at 9 AM Tuck it in latter Part
heavy gale Lat Byols 34.58 South

Thursday these 24 hours Begins with heavy
oct gale from the NW wach employed
the 10 on Boyling ship head NW by N at 3
PM wore ship to the westward at
4 PM Tuck in the fore sail at
Long 6 PM cold down the wach and
6:19 Set the wach middle Part heavy
gale at 4 AM moderate at 5 AM
Set the wach going latter Part
heavy sea on Lat Byols 34.47

Wednesday
oct these 24 hours Begins with strong
the 11 breezes from the NW and heavy sea
all the wach employed on Boyling
at 3 PM saw whale board three
Bouts did not get fast at 5 PM
Tuck in the fore and Mizzen topsails
and set the wach ship head NW by N
middle Part calm at 2 AM finish Boy
ling at 5 AM made sail at 6 AM began
stowing down at 10 AM saw whale board
three Bouts did not stick Boat down
latter Part fish Breeze Lat Byols

Thursday
oct these 24 hours Begins with strong
the 12 breeze from the NW ship head East
2 PM finish stowing down at 3 PM
spoke the ship Sally Ann of New Bedford
and jammed with her at 6 PM Tuck in
sail at 7 PM wore ship to westward
middle Part strong wind from the
NW at 5 AM set about reef topsails
at 9 AM Tuck in the fore and Mizzen
topsails wind in easing to again
latter Part strong gale from the
NW and thick weather so ends
