

Ship Rosalie of Warren

Monday These 24 hours Commence with a fine breeze from the Westward ship under all sail. Employed on ship duty the land not in sight at 5 PM wind increasing fresh in the fore and main sail. Tuck the topsails Middle Port fine breeze and pleasant weather on sail in sight at the tuck on the topsails. Latter part light breeze Lat By obs 55° 32' S Long in 65° 32'.

Tuesday

January These 24 hours Commence with a light breeze from the Westward and pleasant weather ship under all sail. Strong S.W. 43° 40' Middle Port light breeze and fine weather at 8 AM tuck in the main top. Galant sail & tuck the topsails at 9 AM made all sail again. Latter part breezy weather Lat By obs 55° 12' S Long in 64° 32' W.

Wednesday Jan the 2^d

These 24 hours Commence with a light breeze from the Westward ship under all sail heading S.W. at 6 PM wind increasing. Tuck the topsails at 7 PM about the fore and main topsails. No topmast stay sail at 8 AM a heavy gale from the S.W. 40° ship to the S.W. Latter part breezy weather and rough sea on Lat By obs 57° 12' S Long in 64° 40' W.

Thursday

Jan 3^d These 24 hours Commence with a heavy gale from the S.W. ship flying under about the main topsails and fore sail and main stay sail head W by N at 10 AM ship to the S. in the S.W. Middle Port strong gale at 2 AM tuck in the main sail at 3 AM tuck in the fore and main topsails Lat By obs 57° 30' S Long in 64° 50' W.

Continued Jan 1840

Saturday January the 4th These 24 hours Commence with a heavy gale from the S.W. ship under about the topsails heading South. Middle Port strong gales and squally at 6 AM tuck in the main sail at 9 AM set it again. Latter part fresh gale Lat By obs 57° 31' S Long in 65° 40' W.

Sunday

Jan 5th These 24 hours Commence with a fresh gale from the S.W. ship under all sail. Tuck the topsails at 2 PM were ship to the S.E. fore sail in sight. Middle Port heavy gale at 5 PM tuck in the main sail about the main topsails at 6 PM tuck in the fore and main topsails at 9 AM tuck in the fore sail the topmast stay sail and have fore heading S.E. one ship to the leeward at 11 AM set the fore sail and tuck in the ends Lat By obs 57° 04' S Long in 66° 18' W.

Monday

Jan 6th These 24 hours Commence with a heavy gale from the S.W. and squally ship under about the main topsails and fore sail the topmast stay sail and main stay sail at 9 AM set the main sail. Middle Port fresh gale at 3 AM set fore and main topsails about the tuck at 6 AM made all sail one ship in sight off the lee quarter. Latter part fine breeze Lat By obs 57° 44' S Long in 66° 46' W.

Tuesday

January These 24 hours Commence with a fine breeze from the S.W. and fine weather ship under all sail. Strong S.W. 42° 40' was employed on ship duty at 4 PM spoke ahead. Heavy ship Middle Port light breeze. Latter part continued the S.E. day sail in sight Lat By obs 57° 11' S Long in 67° 16' W.
