

Ship Mosaic off Warren

Monday March the 3rd 1857

These 24 hours came with light breeze ship moving to the north at 6 P.M. speak the ship Constitution off Nantucket & made out the small off the middle and latter part came with light breeze strong N.E. at 3:10 P.M.

Tuesday March the 4th

These 24 hours came with light breeze strong N.E. at 4 P.M. saw three whales and the boats and chart did not show at 8 P.M. held up E.S.E. middle and latter part light and calm.

Left N.Y. at 2:25 P.M.

Wednesday March the 5th

These 24 hours came with slight breeze saw black fish and the boats struck landward boat and was lost. Took four black fish to the ship. Middle part pleasant at 10 P.M. saw the land could not see it to end.

Thursday March the 6th

These 24 hours came with light breeze from the N.W. at 2 P.M. the boat came on board and in for the hook of planks for wood and water etc. P.M. came to anchor in 11 fathoms of water in company with the ship. Gave of new breaded biscuits and latter part came with fine breeze.

Friday March the 7th

This day came with light breeze all hands employed on cutting wood and to the ship.

Saturday March the 8th

This day came with light breeze from the S.W. all hands employed on throwing down water to end.

Sunday March the 9th

This day came with slight breeze from the S.W. all hands employed on getting off water barrels and latter part came with pleasant weather.

Monday March the 10th

This day began with light breeze from the S.W. & boats employed on hoisting the mast showing some water. Latter part came with pleasant weather.

Tuesday March the 11th

This day came with fine weather all hands employed getting ready for sea. Middle and latter part came with fine weather.

Wednesday March the 12th

This day came with slight breeze from the S.E. at 4 A.M. but short wind and stood out to sea middle and latter part light breeze to end.

Thursday March the 13th

These 24 hours came with light wind from the south ship under all sail by the wind work employed on ship duty to end.

Friday March the 14th

These 24 hours came with slight wind from the S.W. all hands employed on ship duty to end. Left N.Y. at 1:55 P.M.

Saturday March the 15th

These 24 hours came with light wind from the south and pleasant ship under all sail work employed on ship duty middle part fine day. Latter part continued the same.
