Friday April the 3.

These 24 hours Comm. with light breeze from the S.E. Ship under all sail Steering South Middle Part Calm Latter Part Continued the same Lat 44° 18' Long 91° 12' W

Saturday April the 4

These 24 hours Comm. with slight breeze from the S.E. Ship under all sail Steering S.W. Middle Part light breeze Latter Part Continued the same Lat 44° 25' Long 91° 59' W

Sunday April the 5

These 24 hours Comm. with light breezes and pleasant weather Ship under all sail Steering S.W. Middle Part heavy Latter Part gradually attended with showers off Maine Lat 44° 35' Long 92° 00'

Monday April the 6

These 24 hours Comm. with fine breeze from the Eastward attended with light squalls Ship under all sail Middle Part light Showers of Rain Latter Part light breeze S. Comm. Lat 44° 35' Long 92° 25' W

Tuesday April the 7

These 24 hours Commence with lighter breezes and light Showers off Maine Ship under all sail Steering S.W. Nothing in sight Middle Part Calm saw plenty black birds Latter Part heavy No. on this day Long 92° 00'

Wednesday April the 8

These 24 hours Comm. with fine breeze from the S.E. and gradually Ship under all sail By the wind heading S.W. 45° at 3: saw latter Middle Part heavy Latter Part the same Lat 44° 35' W

Thursday April the 9

These 24 hours Comm. with fine breeze from the S.E. Ship under all sail Steering S.W. 45° one sail in light. At 10:00 standing to the westward Middle Part light Showers of Rain at 5:00 saw 6 sails ahead Latter Part fine breeze Lat 44° 35' Long 92° 00'

Friday April the 10

These 24 hours Comm. with fine breeze from the Eastward Ship under all sail at 4:00 spoke the Marguerite Equator of 2000 Tons and 5 months out 10 lbs of oil at 6:00 spoke the Marguerite Tanka of 1000 Tons 4 months out No oil Middle Part fine breeze Latter Part Continued the same Lat 44° 35' Long 92° 00'

Saturday April the 11

These 24 hours Comm. with fine breeze from the S.E. Ship under all sail Steering East Nothing in sight at 6:00 PM took in sail heave to the South Middle Part fresh breeze at 5:30 PM heard all sail at 9:00 PM at 10:00 PM wind coming from 103° 40' North the Sapsails Latter Part 103° 40' More forward Lat 44° 35' Long 92° 00'

Sunday April the 12

These 24 hours Comm. with fresh breeze from the S.E. Ship under all sail 8:00 AM curing masts employed on Ship duty at 6:00 PM took in sail & head to the South Middle Part fresh breeze at 5:30 AM heard sails and at 4:00 PM Latter part fresh breeze Lat 44° 35' Long 92° 00'

Monday April the 13

These 24 hours Comm. with fine breeze from the S.E. Ship under all sail Steering S.W. 45° one sail in light
