 Cold down breeze



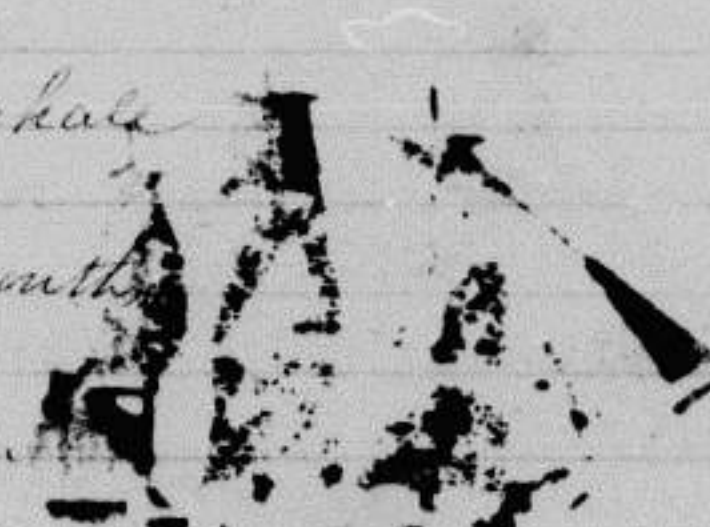
Frid 13 Showed down very rugged
