Remarks Wednesday May 5th day 1841
first part fresh and rainy at 5 P.M. took in four top sails
at 8 P.M. took in four sail middle part moderate breeze from
the N.W. and very rainy at 7 sat four sail later part more
pleasant so ends this 24 hours saw nothing

Lat 35, 14 North Long 67, 45 West

Remarks Thursday May 6th day 1841
Begins with light air and calm middle part fine
breeze from Sth steering N.W. under double reef top sail
later part wind N.W. attended with thick fog so ends this

Lat 35, 24 North Long 68, 00 West

Remarks Friday May 7th day 1841
this 24 hours Begins with thick heavy weather
from the West steering East saw a fine luck and
and prospect sea later part fine weather all hands
in play in ships duty so ends this 24 hours

Lat 35, 20 North Long 67, 10 West

Remarks Saturday May 8th day 1841
first part fine wind from the N.W. steering E
with a heavy swell at 2 P.M. merley calm saw
a brig steering E.P.E. at 3 calm at daylight
fine breeze from the South set half top sails
at noon stormy wind so ends this 24 hours

Lat 35, 10 North

Remarks Sunday May 9th day 1841
first part this 24 hours wind in west clear dawn
and double reef at 2 P.M. raised sperm whales
sled for them but did not catch them they
were going quick to the North took in
four and seven top sails and fore sail
coming on squally and blowing a gale
of wind later part the gale still
continues so ends this 24 hours in

Lat 33, 22 North

Gratitude Of New Bedford 1841

Remarks Monday May 10th day 1841
first part this 24 hours more moderate at
with a heavy swell from the North at 11 P.M.
set four sail and set on the win to West
at daylight set double reef top sails and
steer E all hands in play in ships duty
saw a sail pass to the South so ends

Lat 35, 20 North Long 67, 14 West

Remarks Tuesday May 11th day 1841
first part this 24 hours light wind and fine
weather wind North middle part wind N.W.
attended with thick fog later part fresh gales
from the S.W. and fine weather all hands in
in ships duty saw nothing so ends this 24 hours

Lat 35, 17 North Long 67, 00 West

Remarks Wednesday May 12th day 1841
this 24 Begins with fresh wind from the N.W.
steering East and later stormy wind
and thick weather from the S.W. steering West
at 1 P.M. saw a brig steering to the North
this day no watch in in ships duty so ends

Lat 35, 2 North Long 67, 55 West

Remarks Thursday May 13th day 1841
first part stormy wind from the S.W. steering
attended with sun rain and thick fog steering
N by North under double reef at 6 P.M. double
reef the main top sail so ends this 24 hours

Lat 37 Long 68, 29 West

Remarks Friday May 14th day 1841
first part this 24 hours stormy wind from
the S.W. attended with thick fog and
rain at sun set more moderate at day
light set half top sails head by wind and sun
rain all hands in in ships duty

Lat 39, 12 Long 49, 20 West
