Remarks Saturday May ^{the} 15th 1841
first part of this 24 hours moderate wind attended
with fair wind S West steering E by N at sunset
saw a hump back later part light wind and clear
weather from the S West saw porpoises & seals

Lat 39,43 North Long 47,00 West

Remarks Monday May ^{the} 16th 1841
first part of this 24 hours light wind and fine
weather from the S West steering E N E under
double reefs top sails at 8 PM saw hump backs
at daylight saw a ship steering E by N
at 11 saw fin backs & seals this 24 hours

Lat 40,45 Long 45,45 West

Remarks Monday May ^{the} 17th 1841
first part of this 24 hours had a fine breeze from
the S West attended with fine weather steering
E N E under hulk top sails and main
top of sail saw hump backs at day light
saw a ship steering E N E at 7 saw several
whales ran for them May proved to be
fin backs the latter part of this day strong
wind & seals this 24 hours

Lat 41,44 N Long 43 59 W

Remarks Tuesday May ^{the} 18th 1841
this 24 begins with fresh breeze from
the S W steering E N E under every sail
saw fin backs and porpoises later part more moderate
at 11 a ship put to the South one watch
in flood in ship duty so ends this 24 hours

Remarks Wednesday May ^{the} 19th 1841
first part of this 24 hours moderate wind and
hazy weather wind S S W to W steering
E by N under double reefs saw porpoises and
fin backs later had fresh wind and drizzly
weather from W S W at 12 Brig put our bow
to the South watch in flood in ship duty

Lat 43,27 North Long

Remarks Thursday May ^{the} 20th 1841
first part fine breeze from the West steering E N E
with thick weather mile past more moderate
and thick fog at daylight calms at 1 PM head
a light wind from W S W then came round
S W at 12 saw a Brig steering to the North
saw porpoises and fin backs and seal sounds

Remarks Friday May ^{the} 21st
first part light air from all parts of the compass
with thick heavy sea mile and later head a fresh
gale at noon a ship put to the South steering
to the North and a Brig bound the same way

in Lat 45,13 N Long 36,00 W

Remarks Saturday May ^{the} 22nd 1841
first part of this 24 hours had a fresh breeze from
the W and fine weather steering N E by E
with all sail set saw 3 sail from the north
head steering to the North at 8 PM took in Main
top gulant sail later part fresh breeze steering E N E
saw porpoises and black fish and fin backs so ends this 24 hours

in Lat 46,42 Long 36,12 West

Ship
