

Remarks On Board of

Remarks Sunday May 23rd day 1841
first part of this 24 hours strong winds from the S.W.
steering N by E at 5 P.M. double reefed main topsail
at 7 P.M. hauled down and misen topsails and hoisted
heading to the South blowing a fresh gale until
at 3 P.M. a very mild wind came around to the N.W.
at 8 P.M. made sail and steered E. saw a great number
of fishbacks around this 24 hours this day. Stood 4 miles
in Lat 47 27. N Long 34 20 West

Remarks Monday May 24th day 1841
first part of this 24 hours head light winds and over
cast from the S.W. to N.W. steering by the wind
to the East saw five hawks and blackbirds at sunset
at sun set took in four top sail at day light
sat four and misen topsail and in top gullantail
at noon took in in top gullantail and double
reef a sail in sight so ends this 24 hours
in Lat 47 41 N Long 31 24 West

Remarks Tuesday May 25th day 1841
this 24 begins with strong winds and much weather
from the North and East middle part blew
a gale lying to under close reefed main
top sail at day light the wind came
N.W. reef of N.E. tiller more moderate
at noon sat fairsail saw five hawks around
in Lat 47 43 N Long 31 25 West

Remarks Wednesday May 26th day 1841
begins with very strong winds from the W. by N.
at 3 P.M. took in fairsail and hove to at 5 P.M. came
on to rain and very thick at midnight more
moderate at day light sat four and misen
top sail and fairsail later part wind light
and lighter saw five hawks around this 24 hours
in Lat 48 08 N Long 31 30 West

Ship Gratitude of New Bedford

Remarks Thursday May 27th day 1841
first part light air and calms in flog in
repaireing four topsail later part light winds from
S.E. and fine weather steering East 1 sail in
sight saw five hawks and porpoises seen flood mending
the four top sail so ends this 24 hours
in Lat 47 41 N Long 31 24 West

Remarks Friday May 28th day 1841
this 24 hours begins with light breeze and clear
weather from S.W. steering E at 5 P.M. spoke
Ship Lane of London bound to Quebec
18 days out at sunset at sunset 3 sail in
sight of deck took in four and misen top sail
at 2 P.M. came on thick and drizzly from the S.W.
remains thick the rest of the day so ends
in Lat 48 12 N Long 32 47 West

Remarks Saturday May 29th day 1841
this 24 commences with strong breeze from the S.W.
attended with thick squally rain at 2 P.M. took in
foursail middle part blowing a fresh gale at
daylight more moderate at 4 P.M. sat the
fairsail at 11 sat four and misen topsail
steering N.E. fast 2 sail standing to the West
saw nothing more so ends this 24 hours
in Lat 48 37 N Long 35 38 West

Remarks Sunday May 30th day 1841
first part of this 24 hours more moderate
had the wind from the N.W. steering N.E.
at 2 P.M. saw a Bark and Brig standing to the
west at 4 P.M. took to the N.E. thru the night
had a strong breeze from N.W. by S steering
N.W. under double reefs main top sail
at day light saw a Brig steering N.W.
later part thick and raining at 8 made
sail in Lat 48 47 N Long 37 36 West
