

Remarks on Board Ship

Monday May 31st day 1841
This 24 hours began with strong winds from N by West steering Sth at sunset took in fore and mizen top sail and left to heading N E by E under double reef main top sail middle part quite moderate at daylight calm in place mending main top sail at 9 A.M. breeze from the Sth steering E S E foggy & raining at noon had a strong breeze so ends this 24 hours

Tuesday June 1st day 1841
in Lat 48° 31' North
This 24 hours begins with breeze and thick fog and rain from the Sth at 3 P.M. part a Bury steering to the west middle part had a heavy gale from the N West at midnight cald all hands and close reef the main top sail at daylight the gale began to abate at noon quite moderate being a heavy swell sounds

Wednesday June 2nd day 1841
in Lat 48° 21' North Long 25° 34' West
This 24 hours begins with moderate breeze from and heavy swell from the N S W and from all parts of the compass in place mending main top sail middle part calm later part light breeze from the West steering S S W with all sail out and fine weather sounds

Thursday June 3rd day 1841
in Lat 47° 48' North Long 25° 38' West
first part light winds and fine weather wind S S W at 5 P.M. had a very calm at midnight had light air from the S West raised the yards and steer W S West at 9 P.M. came on thick fog and rain and the wind in excess to a gale at noon hands fore and mizen top sail foremast and jib sail at ship steering to the E Lat 47° 40' Long 25° 50'

Gratitude In The Atlantic Ocean

Friday June 4th day 1841
This 24 hours begins with a gale from the S S W steering by the wind with thick rain weather middle part more moderate at daylight thick fog part a ship and Bury steering E saw blackfish

Saturday June 5th day 1841
in Lat 47° 34' North Long 26° 47' West
This 24 hours begins with moderate breeze and thick weather at 2 P.M. saw branches saw for the sun saw nothing more at 5 P.M. saw a Bury steering N W by North at midnight shot in thick fog later part light wind from the S West steering by the wind to the W W foggy most part of the time sounds

Sunday June 6th day 1841
in Lat 47° 44' North Long 27° 36' West
This 24 hours begins with a moderate breeze and pleasant weather from S S West steering N W by North at sunset took in sail and left to heading West later part fine weather saw several sail steering to the East at 9 P.M. on bent the main top sail and sent a netter

Monday June 7th day 1841
in Lat 48° 04' North Long 28° 20' West
This 24 hours commences with a fine breeze and clear weather from S S West steering N West saw finlucks at sun took in foremast mizen top sail and foremast and left to the West later part had W S W under double reef steering the swim course so ends this 24 hours

Tuesday June 8th day 1841
in Lat 48° 00' North Long 30° 00' West
first part of this 24 hours had fine wind and weather from the South ship heading W S W saw several sail but none took in sail later part close reef main top sail at daylight had close reef foremast mizen top sail had the wind S S E strong & Lat 47° 27' North
