this 24 hours begins with heavy winds
at sunset took in all sail but close reefed main
topsail at sunset moon moderate with rain
at 10 A.M. clear up from the W. W. a schooner
in sight to the E. saw one of the Stern Ship
steering to the Eastward so ends this 24 hours

in Lat 46 55 N Long 30 10 West
Thursday June 10 day 1841

this 24 hours commences with fine weather
at sunset took in all sail but close reefed main
saw several sail in course of the day later part
thick fog and rain and strong winds from the
South so ends in Lat 46 7 North Long 30 10 West

Friday June 11 day 1841

this 24 hours begins with thick misty weather
steering S.W. at 2 P.M. saw a sail to the
windward at sunset shortened sail middle and later
thick fog so ends this 24 hours

in Lat 45 32 N Long 33 26 West
Saturday June 12 day 1841

this 24 hours commences with light winds from
the South steering to the West thru the night
at day light 5 Ships and Boats in sight seen
steering E. and saw West later part moderate
and thick fog so ends this 24 hours

in Lat 45 10 N Long 32 40 West
Sunday June 13 day 1841

this 24 hours begins with light winds from
the S.W. and foggy weather all sail out to the
westward at sunset shortened sail middle

& later much the same in regard
to the wind & weather so ends this 24
hours Jacob H. Parker Turboren
in the Lat 44 20 North Long 31 10 West

Monday June 14 day 1841

this 24 hours with light winds from the S.W. West
and foggy weather middle much the same
later clear and pleasant so ends this 24 hours

in Lat 43 30 North Long 31 10 West
Tuesday June 15 day 1841

this 24 hours begins with strong winds from the
and foggy middle and later misty saw nothing

in Lat 43 45 North Long 31 10 West
Wednesday June 16 day 1841

this 24 hours begins with light winds and variables
at sunset shortened sail middle part strong wind
from N.W. steering S.W. later part calm winds

in Lat 43 23 North Long 31 10 West
Thursday June 17 day 1841

this 24 hours begins with calms middle part
light wind from the East ends with calm saw
nothing this 24 hours short and sweet

in Lat 42 52 North Long 31 07 West
Friday June 18 day 1841

this 24 hours begins with strong winds and
foggy and misty middle and later the same saw
a dead porpoise so ends this 24 hours Jacob H. Parker

in Lat 42 48 North Long 31 07 West
Saturday June 19 day 1841

this 24 hours begins with strong winds from
the W.N.W. steering S.W. at sunset shortened sail
at sunrise made sail later part clear and pleasant

in Lat 39 57 North Long 31 00 West
Sunday June 20 day 1841

this 24 hours begins with strong winds
from the West & pleasant course S.W. at sunset shortened
sail at 12 noon ship to the North at sunrise saw ship

to the S. and made sail at 2 P.M. saw canoe
one of the western islands and flowers later
part moderate in Lat 36 44 North Long 31 10 West
