

Remarks On Board Ship

Sunday June 21 day 1841

this 24 hours begins with light winds and rain weather all sail out thru the night at day light the island in sight and with rain and fog saw several sail steering to the East

in Lat 39° 37' N Long 31° 39' West

Tuesday June 22 day 1841

this 24 hours begins with light winds and rainy weather several sail in sight at 4 PM shortened sail at 5 PM spoke Brig Inga Capt Codworth and Brig Duile 21 months out 350 bbls spermac oil the Inga struck a large whale this day and the latter in morning thru the night at daylight 10 or 12 sail in sight so end clear and pleasant

in Lat 39° 34' N Long 31° 27' West

Wednesday June 23 day 1841

this 24 hours begins with fine weather at sunset shortened sail 8 sail in sight steering at day light 3 sail in sight later part pleasant a gale many sail part this 24 hours so end

in Lat 39° 31' N Long 31° 00' West

Thursday June 24 day 1841

this 24 hours begins with fine weather from the N at sunset took ship of short sail in sight over east thru the night at daylight made sail several Brigs and ships in sight at 10 took ship of shore so end this 24 hours

in Lat 39° 47' N Long 30° 38' West

Friday June 25 day 1841

this 24 hours begins with strong winds from the N steering E. at sunset more ship in shore several sail in sight middle part light signals of rain later part later part clear and pleasant at daylight made all sail

in Lat 39° 56' N Long 30° 35' West

Gratitude In The Atlantic Ocean

Saturday June 26 day 1841

this 24 hours begins with light winds from the N steering S E for the purpose between the islands at sunset shortened sail and headed of shore 2 sail in sight calm thru the night at 5 PM came from the West ship heading in shore at 10 a boat from shore came a long side with four eggs at 11 left for shore several sail in sight so end this 24 hours

in Lat 39° 38' N Long 31° 39' West

Sunday June 27 day 1841

this 24 hours begins with fine winds and weather at sunset shortened sail several sail in sight at daylight made sail several sail in sight so end

in Lat 39° 31' N Long 31° 05' West

Monday June 28 day 1841

begins with fine winds and weather saw a Bark a boyling several others sail in sight pleasant thru the night later part fine

in Lat 39° 00' N Long 32° 10' West

Tuesday June 29 day 1841

this 24 hours begins with strong winds from the S. at sunset saw several sail steering to the East at sunset shortened sail pleasant thru the night at sunrise more ship steering from the island saw number of finbacks so end this 24 hours

in Lat 39° 08' N Long 32° 00' West

Wednesday June 30 day 1841

this 24 hours begins with strong winds from the South saw finbacks and a whale ship at daylight a whale Bark in sight so end this 24 hours

in Lat 39° 25' N Long 31° 15' West
