

Remarks on Board Ship

Wednesday August 18th day 1841
this 24 hours begins with strong winds from the
S East steering S West middle part more moderate
later part saw a ship steering to the South
match in place setting up rigging & such
this 24 hours in Boston & New York & Bedford

Lat 18.03. South Long 34.50. West

Thursday August 19th day 1841
this 24 hours begins with light winds and
pleasant weather at sunset took in all sail
and laid by there the night at day light
made sail and stood West over aim on the
Baker Banks a looking for Spinnaker masts
this 24 hours ends with fine weather

Lat 18.05. South Long 35.52. West

Friday August 20th day 1841
this 24 hours begins with light winds from
the S East steering West saw 3 sail steering to
the South at sunset took in all sail first
part saw fin backs moderate then the night
at day light made sail and stood West at
7 AM saw a large sperm whale land
the landward and waist boat the waist boat
struck the whale several all the time the
landward boat bent on them land the other
2 boats the whale ran to the windward
so ends this 24 hours

Lat 18.13. S Long 36.15. West

Saturday August 21st day 1841
this 24 hours begins with fine winds and
weather at 2 PM took the whale to the
ship and began eating at dark hush
of at day light commences a gain at 12
finishes so ends this 24 hours

Lat 18.17. S Long 36.27. West

Gradulude In The Atlantic ocean

Sunday August 22nd day 1841
this 24 hours begins with fine weather at 2 PM
commence boyling in place boyling
all this 24 hours saw several sail this day

Lat 18.19. S Long 36.34. West

Monday August 23rd day 1841
this 24 hours begins with fine light wind and
weather all hands in place boyling pleasant
thru the night at day light made sail to the
S East so ends this 24 hours

Lat 18.44. S Long 36.46. West

Tuesday August 24th day 1841
this 24 hours begins with fine pleasant weather
at sunset took in all sail later part strong winds
from the South saw 2 Brigs so ends this 24 hours

Lat 18.00. S Long 36.42. West

Wednesday August 25th day 1841
this 24 hours begins with strong wind from the
South employed in looking out the main & mast
for empty cask squally thru the night later part
saw several sail whalers so ends this 24 hours

Lat 18.15. S Long 36.32. West

Thursday August 26th day 1841
this 24 hours begins with strong winds from
the South saw hump backs at 5 PM spoke the
Brig Charleston Packet of New Bedford
months out 220 lbs sperm oil & 4 Stups
and Brigs in sight later part more moderate

Lat 18.26. S Long 36.15. West

Friday August 27th day 1841
this 24 hours begins with pleasant wind and
weather at sunset shortened sail 2 sail in
sight at day light 3 sail in sight
saw fin backs and hump backs so ends this 24 hours

Lat 18.46. S Long 36.08. West
