

Remarks on Board Ship

Tuesday October 19<sup>th</sup> day 1841  
this 24 hours begins with light winds  
from the East ship heading South with  
all sail out at 2 P.M. saw a brig lower a round  
the East end of Staten Land at sunset wind  
light and calm at day light light wind from  
the West the island in sight later part  
strong wind at 12 past the East end of  
Staten Land so ends this 24 hours

Lat 44,50 S Long 69,50 West

Wednesday Oct 20 day 1841  
this 24 hours begins with strong winds  
from the West steering S by West  
at 1 P.M. reef the top sails strong wind  
thru the night later part let 1 reef out  
of the top sails and set main top gulant  
and jib strong winds so ends this 24 hours

Lat 56,22 S Long 64,20 West

Thursday Oct 21 day 1841  
this 24 hours begins with strong winds  
from the West thick and rainy ship  
heading S West the anchor in place taking  
and making sail all this 24 hours saw  
squares and caplin but mile from the place  
so ends this 24 hours

Lat 56,45 S Long 66,40 West

Friday October 22 day 1841  
this 24 hours begins with strong winds from  
the South ship heading West under single  
reef at 2 took in jib and m top of sail mill  
and later more moderate ship under single  
reef saw several of snow so ends this 24 hours

Lat 57,02 South Long 69,52 West

Continued a round Cape Horn

Saturday October 23 day 1841  
this 24 hours begins with strong winds from the West  
ship heading S West under single reef and m top gulant  
sail made all sail several times this 24 hours  
middle and later ship heading S West so ends

Lat 58,08 S Long 67,46 West

Sunday Oct 24 day 1841  
this 24 hours begins more moderate wind ship  
heading W West heavy swell from the W thick and  
over cast middle part reef every thing later  
part thick and rainy saw snow so ends this 24 hours

Lat 58,17 S Long 70,23 West

Monday October 25 day 1841  
this 24 hours begins with strong winds from the West  
ship heading S West by W thick and rainy middle  
part let 1 reef out of the top sails and the reef out  
of the mainsail and set the jib later part  
more pleasant so ends this 24 hours

Lat 58,47 S Long 72,53 West

Tuesday October 26 day 1841  
this 24 hours begins with gail of wind from the West  
at 3 P.M. took in jib and m top sail and  
reef the mainsail thick fog and rainy at sunset  
took in all sail but the 3 top sails and foresail  
blowing a heavy gail head full sail in but close  
reef m top sail at 10 set foresail and  
mison topsail heavy squalls of hail and snow  
so ends this 24 hours thick and overcast

Lat 59,14 S Long 74,14 West

Wednesday Oct 27 this 24 hours begins with  
heavy gail from the West at 4 P.M. move ship to  
the N and West under close reef m top sail and  
foresail at 11 took in all sail but close reef  
m topsail blowing a heavy gail later more moderate  
so ends this 24 hours

Lat 59,24 S Long 74,36 West

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
