

Remarks on board Ship Gratitude

Thursday October 28th day 1841

this 24 hours begins with fine weather all sail out ship heading N West first part took in m top gulant sail 2 P.M. double reefed the top sails at 5 took in jib and close reefed so ends this 24 hours

Lat 57 25 South Long 74 58 West

Friday October 29th day 1841

this 24 hours begins more pleasant wind N West ship heading S West under close reef and courses saw magpies porpoises and blackfish at 4 A.M. let 1 reef out of the top sails and set m top of sail a heavy swell from the West squalls of rain quite light

Lat 60, 10 South Long 76 07 West

Saturday October 30th day 1841

this 24 hours begins with strong wind and a heavy swell from the West ship heading N West light squalls of fog and rain ship under single reef at 8 P.M. took in all sail but close reefed m top sail and foresail at 2 A.M. set reef mainsail at 5 set the jib and let 1 reef out of the topsails rainy thru the night and I lost my hat over board so ends this 24 hours cool but cold

Lat 57 43 S Long 76 15 West

Sunday October 31st day 1841

this 24 hours begins with strong wind N West ship heading N West light squalls of rain thru the night later part took in jib and took 1 reef in the topsails this 24 ends with strong winds

Lat 58 20 S Long 75 30 West

Monday November 1st this 24 hours begins

with strong gales from the N West at 8 P.M. close reefed the topsails and reefed the mainsail and wore ship to the S W middle part thick and rainy later part took in all sail but close reefed main topsail later part heavy gail from the North ship heading West Lat 53 17 S Long West

Of Cape Horn October 1841

Tuesday Nov 2nd day 1841

this 24 hours begins with a heavy gail from the N West ship lying to under close reef on top sail at 2 P.M. manded set foresail and single reefed fore and main top sails at 5 A.M. clear and pleasant at 10 A.M. close reefed them again and wore ship to the S West thick snow squalls

so ends Lat 57 20 S Long 76 35 West

Wednesday Nov 3rd day 1841

this 24 hours begins with strong gails from the N West ship heading S West under close reef on topsail thick snow squalls at 4 A.M. wind came S West wore ship and steered N West with a fair wind some more later part thick and overcast sun rain and snow so ends

and the Lat 58 38 S Long 77 58 West

Thursday Nov 4th day 1841

this 24 hours begins with strong winds and squally weather from the S West steering N West with single reefs at 4 A.M. made all sail wind light at 10 bore from the S West at 11 took in main top of sail thick and overcast so ends this

24 hours Lat 56 47 South Long 77 00 West

Friday November 5th day 1841

this 24 hours begins with strong gales from the N West thick and rainy ship heading N West at 2 P.M. double reef fore and main topsail rainy thru the night at 4 A.M. wind S West wore ship and steered West later part more pleasant sun over cast so ends this 24 hours (astonish)

and Lat 56 27 S Long 80 00 West

Saturday November 6th day 1841 this 24 hours

begins with light winds from the S West steering N West with all sail out saw blackfish and grasshoppers later part rain from the South took ship to the N West thick fog and light rain so ends this 24 hours in the Lat 55 39 South Long 82 00 West
