

Remarks on board Ship's Latitude on  
Tuesday Nov 30 day 1841

this 24 hours begins with light winds sun pinches  
and blackish sun part standing of shore and  
sun part one shore saw several ships this  
day so ends this 24 hours in the

Lat 43 55 South Long 172 30 West

Wednesday Dec 1 day 1841

this 24 hours begins with light winds and pleasant  
weather all hands in flood stowing down the  
aid that we got on the cables lanks at 2 P.M.  
Spoke ship Zenith Copin of San Pedro 16  
minutes out 15 50 lbs at 5 P.M. finished stowing  
down at sunset 4 ships in sight pleasant  
thru the night at day light made all sail  
2 ships in sight so ends this 24 hours

Lat 44 04 S Long 174 35 West

Thursday Dec 2 day 1841

this 24 hours begins with fine wind and weather  
at sunset shortened sail pleasant thru the  
night at sunrise made sail and stood in shore  
was in to the land and wore ship of shore

so ends in Lat 43 43 S Long 174 24 West

Friday Dec 3 day 1841

this 24 hours begins with light winds and pleasant  
weather the Capt is employ'd fitting the mizen  
chains saw humpbacks and plenty of squill  
at sunset took in sail and hauled of shore several  
ships in sight at day light made sail and stood  
in shore so ends this 24 hours

Lat 43 39 S Long 177 07 West

Saturday Dec 4 day 1841

this 24 hours begins with at sunrise squared the  
yards and stand fast day light made all  
sail and stood a long shore saw a Brig steering  
to the South and the wind so ends this 24 hours Lat 42 27 S Long 174 30 W

Turn and in the harbor of Callao  
Sunday Dec 5 day 1841

this 24 hours begins with light winds and pleasant  
weather at sunset took in all sail and large day  
thru the night at day light made all sail  
and stood in for Callao where we came to an  
anchor at 2 P.M. so ends this 24 hours in port

Lat. S Long West

Monday Dec 6 day 1841

this 24 hours fine weather at 2 P.M. came to anchor  
in Callao there is 1 whaler and 1 slop of  
more in and a gathering of French and English  
merchman pleasant thru the night at day  
light sent a raft of casks a shore of water  
so ends this 24 hours in the harbor of Callao

Tuesday Dec 7 day 1841

this 24 hours begins with fine weather employ'd getting  
of water and stowing in down the main hatch and

Wednesday Dec 8 day 1841

this 24 hours begins with fine weather employ'd in  
getting of water at sunset finished later part  
was fast day doing nothing so ends this 24 hours

Thursday Dec 9 day 1841

this 24 hours begins with fine weather this first  
part feast gave all hands liberty at sunrise  
sun came on board and stood a shore saw drunk  
and few sailors so ends this 24 hours

Friday December 10 day 1841

this 24 all hands in flood getting of victuals 4 of  
us on liberty 3 of us went up to Lima to see  
the city 1 man runaway at sunrise in and the  
rest went on board we had a shore at Conting  
also part horse eshort. 2 P.M. got under way
