This 24 hours begins with fine wind and weather from the SE at sunset in sail and moon ships to the South saw finbacks made and later fine and pleasant

Saturday Feb ^{the} 26 day 1842

This 24 hours begins with light trade and pleasant weather standing SSW at sunset in sail middle part light squalls of rain at day light made sail and steered S saw finbacks so ends

Sat N Long West
Sunday Feb ^{the} 27 day 1842

This 24 hours begins with strong winds and squally weather steering N by E strong wind three the night at 9 o'clock took in main top of sail at 12 saw a sperm whale rising land the boats saw nothing more of him so ends this 24 hours in the

Monday Feb ^{the} 28 day 1842

This 24 hours begins with strong winds at sunset single reef the top sails middle and later squally and rainy steering N by E so ends this 24 hours in the

Tuesday Feb ^{the} 29 day 1842

This 24 hours begins with strong wind at sunset took in main sail made and later the same with squalls so ends

Wednesday Feb ^{the} 28 this 23 hours

begins with strong winds steering N by E at 2 sat the 11 sail light squalls of rain so ends

This 24 hours begins with strong winds and squally weather steering N West middle and later more pleasant so ends

Saturday March ^{the} 2 day 1842

This 24 hours begins with fine wind and weather from the N by E steering S by W middle and later steered N by W saw nothing so ends this 24 hours Jacob the Barker in the

Sat N Long West
Sunday March ^{the} 3 day 1842

This 24 hours begins with strong trade first part sent down fore top galeant mast steering N by W middle part squally and rainy later more pleasant saw finbacks so ends

Sat N Long West
Monday March ^{the} 4 day 1842

This 24 hours begins with fine winds and weather steering N by W middle and later clear and pleasant so ends in the

Sat N Long West
Tuesday March ^{the} 5 day 1842

This 24 hours begins with fine trade and pleasant weather steering N by E later found on board the fairsail and repaired it and bent it a gain steering West saw finbacks so ends this 24 hours in the

Sat N Long West
Wednesday March ^{the} 6 day 1842

This 24 hours begins with fine mi and weather first part sent down main top of sail and repaired it and bent it a gain and first at

later part sat in top of great squalls of rain so ends this 24 hours in the
