this 24 hours begins with calms at 3 P.M. took strong breeze and steer for Makoo at sunset the N.W. end in sight at 9 shorten sail and hove to three the night at daylight esp of for the harbor at 9 to 10 the boat went on shore ship lying of and on

Tuesday March 29 1842

this 24 hours begins with fine m and weather at 10 P.M. the boat came on board with orders to let go the anchor the boat went on shore again sent 6 lbs flour on shore at 11 orders came that we must get under way so ends this 24 hours

Wednesday 30 day 1842

this 24 hours begins with fine wind and weather first part got under way and sent the boat for the Captain at 4 P.M. he came a board and put sea steering S by W wind East ~~so ends this 24 hours~~ later part flew a man and sent him to his duty ends with light wind and overcast weather

Lat 20, 55 N Long 160, 11 W

Thursday March 31 1842

this 24 hours begins with light winds and rainy steering W by S wind East middle and later the same steering West so ends this 24 hours

Lat 20, 48 N Long 161, 45 West

Friday April 1 day 1842

this 24 hours begins with moderate wind and thick rainy weather from the East steering W by S saw nothing of any account this 24 hours so ends

in the Lat 21, 16 N Long 163, 42 West

Saturday April 2 day 1842

first part fine wind and weather middle and later light air and calms in flood making ignorance and making span year saw nothing remarkable so ends this 24 hours Lat 21, 03 N Long 164, 27 W

this 24 hours begins with fine wind and air weather steering W.S.W. all this 24 hours later part light squalls of rain

so ends Lat 19, 50 N Long 165, 00 West

Saturday April 4 day 1842

this 24 hours begins with fine wind and air steering W.S.W. with all sail out this 24 hours so ends this day

in Lat 19, 30 N Long 165, 00 West

Sunday April 5 day 1842

this 24 hours begins with fine wind and smoky weather steering W.S.W. all this 24 hours so ends in the

Lat 19, 10 N Long 165, 00 West

Monday April 6 day 1842

this 24 hours begins with fine winds from N.E. steering W.S.W. all this 24 hours saw nothing so ends with light squalls

in the Lat 19, 00 N Long 165, 00 West

Tuesday April 7 day 1842

this 24 hours begins with strong winds later part light squalls of rain steering W by S all this 24 hours so ends

in Lat 18, 50 N Long 165, 00 West

Friday April 8 day 1842

this 24 hours begins with strong wind steering W by S all this 24 hours so ends this day of our land over

Lat 18, 30 North Long 165, 00 West

Saturday April 9 day 1842

this 24 hours begins with strong winds steering W by S all this 24 hours so ends in Lat 18, 10 N Long 165, 00

Sunday April 10 day 1842

this 24 hours begins with strong winds and pleasant weather steering W by S with all sail all this 24 hours so ends

in the Lat 18, 00 North Long 165, 00 West

Monday April 11 day 1842

this 24 hours begins with strong winds and fine weather first part steer West later steer W.N. West so ends this 24 hours in the Lat 17, 30 N Long 165, 00
