

Remarks On Board Ship

Tuesday April 12th day 1842

This 24 hours begins with strong winds and pleasant weather middle and later steering N West the Captain is so well so that he is obliged to say he nearly all of his time so ends this 24 hours in Sat N Long

Saturday Apr 13th day 1842

This 24 hours begins with light winds middle and later very moderate steering N West Capt no better in Sat N Long

Sunday Apr 14th day 1842

This 24 hours begins with moderate weather steering N West all this 24 hours saw 9 whales midday and later moderate so ends in Sat N Long

Monday April 15th day 1842

This 24 hours begins with light winds and calm middle and later light wind from S E steering N West saw finback so ends in Sat N Long

Tuesday April 16th day 1842

This 24 hours begins with fine winds and pleasant weather from the South steering N West with all sail out all this 24 in Sat N Long

Wednesday April 17th day 1842

This 24 hours begins with light wind from the North thick and overcast ship heading N West by W on the wind at sunset took in all sail but double reefed top sails and four sail later put out 1 reef out of the top sails and set main sail so ends this 24 hours in Sat N Long

Thursday April 18th day 1842

This 24 hours begins with strong winds from the North ship heading N West by W at 10 A.M. set main top galant sail and back ship to the East so

Friday April 19th Sat Long

This 24 hours begins with fine weather ship heading N West under single reef in Sat N Long East

Wednesday April 20th day 1842

This 24 hours begins with strong winds from the N West ship heading N East middle and later strong winds so ends in Sat N Long East

Thursday April 21st day 1842

This 24 hours begins with strong winds from the N West middle reefed top sails and took ship to the West later strong winds and squally weather so ends this 24 in Sat N Long East

Friday April 22nd day 1842

This 24 hours begins with heavy winds from the N East and squally at sunset shortened sail and commenced storming boats crew much ship heading N West later part wind East made sail and steer N West so ends this 24 hours in Sat N Long East

Saturday April 23rd day 1842

This 24 hours begins with pleasant weather steering N West at sunset in all sail and left to the South at daylight made sail and steered N West so ends this 24 hours in Sat N Long East

Sunday April 24th day 1842

This 24 hours begins with fine winds steering to the South and West at sunset in sail and left to the wind to the S E at daylight made sail and steered S E 77 in Sat N Long East

Monday April 25th day 1842

This 24 hours begins with light wind and foggy weather at sunset in sail and left to the S at daylight made sail and steered N West in Sat N Long East

Tuesday April 26th day 1842

This 24 hours begins with fine winds from the E first part steered N West at sunset in sail to the North middle and later thick and foggy saw nothing Joseph the board
