this 24 hours begins with the strong winds from the SSE ship heading to the S at sunset in four and misen topsail thick fog from the night later part in fore and aft and close reef

this 24 hours ends with thunder and lightning

Friday April 29<sup>th</sup> day 1842

this 24 hours begins with heavy winds and rain ship SSW under close reef in topsail later part more mornant sat foresail ends calm Japan and so forth

Saturday April 30<sup>th</sup> day 1842

this 24 hours begins with mornant weather ship heading NE thunder and lightning from the night later more pleasant made sail and steered NE wind from the SSW

Sunday May 1<sup>st</sup> day 1842

this 24 hours begins with fine winds and weather from the S at sunset in sail and left to the SE at daylight made sail and steered NE later part light wind so ends

Monday May 2<sup>nd</sup> day 1842

this 24 hours begins with light winds from the S at sunset in sail at daylight made sail saw porpoises so ends

Tuesday May 3<sup>rd</sup> day 1842

this 24 hours begins with mornant weather at sunset in sail at daylight made it a gain light air so ends this 24 hours on Japan

Friday May 9<sup>th</sup> day 1842

this 24 hours begins with strong winds from the East standing to the S at sunset in sail at daylight made sail and steered South so ends this 24

Saturday May 10<sup>th</sup> day 1842

this 24 hours begins with strong winds from the East steering S at sunset in sail and left to the S at daylight made sail and steered NE so ends

Sunday May 11<sup>th</sup> day 1842

this 24 hours begins with strong winds from the East at sunset in sail at daylight made sail in steer NE so ends

Monday May 12<sup>th</sup> day 1842

this 24 hours begins with fine weather from the E at sunset in sail at daylight made sail and steered SSW so ends

Tuesday May 13<sup>th</sup> day 1842

this 24 hours begins with fine weather from the S steering NE at sunset in sail and left to the S at daylight made sail to the SW

Wednesday May 14<sup>th</sup> day 1842

this 24 hours begins with light winds at sunset in sail to the S at daylight made sail ship heading NE so ends saw porpoises
