

Remarks On Board Ship

Monday June 20th day 1842

This 24 hours fine breeze and pleasant weather all hands
in flood baying so ends this 24 hours

Tuesday June 21st day 1842

This 24 hours fine weather at 2 P.M. firmish baying the 3
whales turned up 200 bls later commens looking
out so ends

Wednesday June 22nd day 1842

This 24 hours begins with light wind and thick weather
all in flood stoving down at 5 P.M. took of an account
of rain at daylight pleasant made sail all hands in
flood stoving down on 3 fine and pleasant

Thursday June 23rd day 1842

This 24 hours begins with strong breeze from the East
at 5 P.M. firmish stoving down at daylight made
sail strong breeze from the N.E. so ends this 24 hours

Friday June 24th day 1842

This 24 hours begins with strong winds from the N.E. at 2 P.M.
saw a ship a cutting at sunset took ship to the N.W. and
in sail rainy thru the night with sun thunder and pleasant

Saturday June 25th day 1842

This 24 hours begins with thick squally weather from the East
at 2 P.M. saw a ship to the leeward at sunset in sail
ship heading N.E. at daylight sat four and miser topsails
end with heavy squalls of wind and rain

Sunday June 26th day 1842

This 24 hours begins with heavy squalls of rain and wind at
4 P.M. more pleasant at sunset in sail in more ships
to the S.W. at daylight made sail 11 a ship past to the leeward
of us in the Sat South Yang East

Latitude On Japan In the Pacific

Monday June 27th day 1842

This 24 hours begins with strong winds from the N.E. at sunset
took ship to the N. East and in sail later part saw 3 ships
standing to the South saw penbacks so ends this day

Tuesday June 28th day 1842

This 24 hours begins with fine winds and pleasant weather from the
E.S.E. at sunset took ship to the S at daylight 3 ships in sight
at 6 P.M. took ship to the N. East ends fine and pleasant

Wednesday June 29th day 1842

This 24 begins with fine winds and pleasant weather middle and
later much the same so ends this 24 hours

Thursday June 30th day 1842

This 24 hours begins with fine breeze from the S.S.E. pleasant thru
the night at 4 P.M. took ship to the S.E. ends fine and pleasant

Friday July 1st day 1842

This 24 hours begins with fine winds and pleasant from the East
at sunset in sail part a ship to leeward at day light made
all sail saw penbacks so ends this 24 hours

Saturday July 2nd day 1842

This 24 hours with fine winds and pleasant first part saw a ship to
the windward at sunset in sail to the N. at daylight made all sail
saw a ship to wind and sailing in flood setting the main
rigging so ends

Sunday July 3rd day 1842

This 24 hours begins with fine wind and pleasant weather at 2 P.M.
took ship to the S.S.E. at daylight made sail saw several
ships & baying so ends this 24 hours
