

Remarks on Board Ship

Monday July 4th day 1842

This 24 hours begins with fine air and pleasant weather at 2 P.M. took ship and spoke ship Zephyr of New Bedford 37 months out 1900 bbls at day light saw whales land 4 boats the starboard boat struck and a road parted the line and the whale went up at 10 boats went and board whales still in sight so ends this 24 hours

in Sat S Gang East

Tuesday July 5th day 1842

This 24 hours fine breeze and pleasant weather at 12 the Zephyr took to the S.E. at 2 P.M. board 4 boats the bow boat struck and held at 5 P.M. took him to the ship and command seeing the boat Steerer got badly bit by a shark at 11 P.M. firmish and commenced voyaging

Wednesday July 6th day 1842

This 24 hours begins with light air and pleasant weather in flood voyaging later part firmish saw a ship to the windward

in the Sat S Gang East

Thursday July 7th day 1842

This 24 hours begins with light winds and pleasant weather at sunset in sail 1 ship in sight mid S.S.W. later part strong winds and squally so ends this 24 hours

in Sat S Gang East

Friday July 8th day 1842

This 24 hours with strong air and squally weather first part took in the topsail's middle and later much the same saw a ship

in Sat S Gang East

Saturday July 9th day 1842

This 24 hours begins with thick rainy weather at 4 P.M. set fore and topsail at sunset in sail more pleasant a very heavy swell at daylight made run sail thick and overcast saw a ship so ends this 24 hours

Sunday July 10th day 1842

This 24 hours begins with strong winds all hands in flood voyaging

Monday July 11th day 1842

This 24 hours begins with a heavy swell and boisterous winds at 3 P.M. saw spinnaker whales going quick to the boat the wind came on from the S.W. blue heavy and rain lost sight of them and in all sail middle and later heavy wind saw a ship to the west

in the Sat S Gang East

Tuesday July 12th day 1842

This 24 hours begins fine breeze at 6 P.M. spoke ship Walter Scott of New York 20 months out 450 bbls middle and later calm

in Sat S Gang East

Wednesday July 13th day 1842

This 24 hours begins with fine winds from the S.W. at 2 P.M. saw a large spinnaker whale land the most boat struck the starboard fastend and held up at 3 P.M. took him a long side and cut in the body and by by the hand threw the night later took the head in and commenced voyaging

in Sat S Gang East

Thursday July 14th day 1842

This 24 hours with strong wind all hands in flood voyaging all this 24 hours

Friday July 15th day 1842

This all hands in flood voyaging in later part topgirt thick and smoky later strong wind saw a ship to the west

in Sat S Gang East

Saturday July 16th day 1842

This 24 hours begins with strong winds and smoky weather middle and later much the same so ends this 24 hours

in Sat S Gang East

Sunday July 17th day 1842

This 24 hours begins with strong wind and smoky weather at daylight commenced steering down later part saw squalls of rain so ends this 24 hours

in the Sat S Gang East
