Thursday August ²⁵ day 1842

this 24 hours begins with fresh breeze from the S.E. at sunset in with top of sails middle and later heavy winds took ship 3 times this 24 hours so ends this day

in Sat N' Long East

Friday August ²⁶ day 1842

this 24 hours begins with strong winds at 2 P.M. saw 3 sperm whales land and chase till sunset got nothing in sail a ship in sight to windward later strong wind so ends

in Sat N' Long East

Saturday August ²⁷ day 1842

this 24 hours begins with strong wind at sunset in sail at daylight made sail and took ship to the East so ends this 24 hours

in Sat N' Long East

Sunday August ²⁸ day 1842

this 24 hours begins with strong wind from the East at sunset in sail at daylight made sail saw a ship to the West

so ends in Sat N' Long East

Monday August ²⁹ day 1842

this 24 hours begins with strong wind from the East at sunset in sail and saw ship to the East at daylight made sail and saw ship to the West saw finlocks

in Sat N' Long East

Tuesday August ³⁰ day 1842

this 24 hours begins with strong wind from the East at 12 took ship to the East at 8 P.M. took the Barque Ranger of London 26 months 800 lbs at daylight made sail and saw ship to the East saw jumpers so ends this 24 hours

in the Sat both Long East

Wednesday August ³¹ day 1842

this 24 hours begins with strong winds from the East all sail out this 24 hours trying to get to the Eastward so ends this 24 hours the day of this month

in Sat both Long East

Thursday September ¹ day 1842

this 24 hours begins fresh breeze middle thick and squally in all sail at daylight more pleasant made sail to the East to get so ends in Sat N' Long East

Friday Sept ² day 1842

this 24 hours begins with strong winds from the East at sunset in sun sail saw a ship to the leeward at daylight made sail saw a ship to the windward so ends this 24 hours

in Sat N' Long East

Saturday Sept ³ day 1842

this 24 hours begins with st wind from the East at 8 P.M. took ship to the East later part squally and rainy at 11 took spoke the ship Peruvian of Santos 23 months out 1300 lbs and more pleasant Sat N' Long East

Sunday Sept ⁴ day 1842

this 24 hours begins with fine breeze and pleasant weather at 1 P.M. saw sperm whales land the boats the Peruvians boat struck and drove the ice and the whales went off at sunset but 2 reefs in the topsails middle and later wind light so ends the day

in the Sat N' Long East

Monday Sept ⁵ day 1842

this 24 hours begins with light air from the West steering East at sunset in sail middle and later wind very light

in the Sat N' Long East

Tuesday Sept ⁶ day 1842

this 24 hours wind light from the East middle and later nearly calm saw a ship so ends

in the Sat N' Long East

Wednesday Sept ⁷ day 1842

this 24 hours begins with moderate weather and rainy at sunset in the light sails later part head a breeze from the West and steered East to see a ship and plenty of finlocks so ends

in the Sat N' Long East
