Thursday Sept ^{the} 8 day 1842

This 24 hours begins with fine winds and weather from the
W. S. W. steering E. S. E. at sunset in sail and left on our
course at daylight made sail saw a ship to the East
and a Barque the the ad. so ends this 24 hours

in Lat ^{S. Gang} East
Friday Sept 9 day 1842

This 24 hours begins with fine winds and pleasant weather
from the West steering East at sunset in sail at day
light made sail at 4 A.M. saw a Spinnaker whale
bored the boats the Starboard boat was most on and the
waist boat ran a foul of the haw and stop haw and
went to the whale but did not go near night to only
- near him slip in Chace so ends this 24 victory

in Lat ^{S. Gang} East
Saturday Sept 10

This 24 hours begins with pleasant we at 2 P.M. the boat
came on board 3 Ship in Chace of the whale at 5 P.M.
land a gain at sunset the Starboard boat struck and
Starboard boat fastened and held him at 9 P.M.
took him to the ship and in sail and got ready for eating
at daylight hook on at 12 finish and began to haul
sum difficulty between the 1 and Second mate

all this 24 hours in flood laying at 12 finish saw
2 ships and in Lat ^{S. Gang} East

Monday Sept 12 day 1842

1700 lbs at 5 spoke the Bark Thanes of London 28 m. m.
and 400 lbs. later part pleasant saw ships and a Carver
so ends this 24 hours greatly time on board
the Ship Goulitude i sui so end i believe so

Tuesday September 13 day 1842

this 24 hours begins with fine wind and pleasant weather from the E. S. E.
at sunset in sail later part thick and rainy so ends this day

Wednesday Sept 14 day 1842

this 24 hours begins with light wind and rainy weather from
the S. at sunset in all sail later part more pleasant in
flood strong down at 12 finish so ends this 24 hours

in Lat ^{S. Gang} East
Thursday Sept 15 day 1842

this 24 hours begins with fine breeze from the S. S. E. and
later wind E. S. E. took ship to the South saw a Ship steering
S. E. so end in Lat ^{S. Gang} East

Friday Sept 16 day 1842

this 24 hours begins with fine winds and pleasant we from the
South in flood mending main topsail later made all
sail ship heading South saw a ship steering to the West

in Lat ^{S. Gang} East
Saturday Sept 17 day 1842

this 24 hours begins with fine wind from the E. S. E. at sunset
doubled reef the topsails and took ship to the S. E. in flood
mending main topsail at daylight made all sail so ends

in Lat ^{S. Gang} East
Sunday Sept 18 day 1842

this 24 hours begins with fine wind and weather from the
E. S. E. at sunset double reef at daylight made all sail
so ends in Lat ^{S. Gang} East

Monday Sept 19 day 1842

this 24 hours begins with fine wind and we from the E. S. E. at
4 P.M. took ship to the S. E. at sunset reef at daylight
made sail in flood mending sails so ends the

Tuesday Sept 20 day 1842

this 24 hours fine wind and pl. weather from the E. S. E. at
sunset in the light sails at daylight made all sail ship
heading S. S. E. in the Lat ^{S. Gang} East
