

Remarks On Board Ship

Thursday Oct 6 day 1842

this 24 light winds from S to W steering E middle and later
the sun Sat N Song West

Friday Oct 7 day 1842

this 24 hours light wind from the SW to WNW
steering E by S and fine and pleasant Sat N Song West

Saturday Oct 8 day 1842

this 24 hours with fine wind and pleasant we at 3 PM
spoke Ship Bartholomew Gosnold of Salem
later found 2 ships in sight steering to the East
in Sat N Song West

Sunday Oct 9 day 1842

this 24 hours fine wind and weather from the S steering East at
4 PM spoke the Gosnold again at day light 3 ships in sight
steering E Sat N Song West

Monday Oct 10 day 1842

this 24 hours begins with thick rainy weather from the E & E
at sunset took ship to the E and in evening later found
wind S & ship heading E. SE 3 ships in sight so end
Sat N Song East

Tuesday Oct 11 day 1842

this 24 hours wind held to the SW then steered E by S later
wind S.W. and strong breeze saw 2 ships so end this 24 hours
Sat N Song West

Wednesday Oct 12 day 1842

this 24 hours strong wind from the WNW steering E & E
later wind from the SSE saw 2 ships ends with sun in
Sat N Song West

Thursday Oct 13 day 1842

this 24 begins light wind and overcast weather at 4 PM
took to the S.W. later wind held S.W. and pleasant
2 ships in sight steering to the S and East
Latitude N Song 47°

Friday Oct 14 day 1842

this 24 hours begins with a fine breeze from the S.W. steering
E & E later wind held S.W. saw 2 ships to the E of our
Sat N Song West

Saturday Oct 15 day 1842

this 24 hours begins with a strong breeze from the S.W. & sat found
topmast steering sail steering E by S later wind S.W. in flood setting
up shocks Sat N Song West

Sunday Oct 16 day 1842

this 24 hours begins with fine wind from the S.W. steering E & E at
sunset 2 ships in sight middle and later wind held so end
Sat N Song West

Monday Oct 17 day 1842

this 24 hours begins with light winds from the S & E in flood
setting up shocks middle and later wind S & saw 2 ships
in the Sat N Song West

Tuesday Oct 18 day 1842

this 24 hours begins with light winds from the S & E at 4
PM spoke the Bark Edge of New Bedford 35 months
800 middle and later wind S steering E by S so end this day
in the Sat N Song West

Wednesday Oct 19 day 1842

this 24 hours begins with fine wind and air from the S steering
E by S middle and later light saw nothing so end
in Sat N Song West

Thursday Oct 20 day 1842

this 24 hours begins with light winds from the S.W. later
the wind S and squally at 10 A.M. dable up the top sails
in the Sat N Song West

Friday Oct 21 day 1842

this 24 hours begins with strong winds from the S steering S & E
at 6 PM let 1 reef out the topmasts middle part put
them in a gain later steered S & E by S so end this 24 hours
in the Latitude N Song West
