in the lat ^{N^W} of Longitude ^{West}

Monday Oct ^{the} 24 day 1842

this 24 hours begins with strong breeze from the N^W at sunset
shorten sail at 12 kt sun the land later part
came to an anchor in the harbor of Monrovia there is 12
ships lying to anchor in the harbor so ends the 24 hours

in fine weather all this 24 hours in flood getting water

Wednesday Oct ^{the} 26 day 1842

in fine weather all this 24 hours in flood getting water

Sunday Oct ^{the} 30 day 1842

each the day discharging 3 canoes all ready for sea

Monday Oct ^{the} 31 day 1842

Tuesday Nov ^{the} 1 day 1842

first part of this 24 hours ship 2 canoes

later part took the anchor and put to sea

with 28 men on board standing to the N^W

Wednesday Nov ^{the} 2 day

this 24 hours began and pleasant weather standing
to the N^W saw nothing Lat ^{N^W} of Longitude ^{West}

Thursday Nov ^{the} 3 day 1842

this 24 hours fine wind from the E standing to the N^W East
middle and later the rain so ends this 24 hours

Wednesday Nov ^{the} 4 day 1842

this 24 hours begins with brisk winds and light squalls of rain
standing to the N^W middle and later fine and pleasant so ends

Saturday Nov ^{the} 5 day 1842

this 24 hours strong winds from the N^W ship heading of S by W later
part strong winds in with top g. sails and dulle reef the topsails

Sunday Nov ^{the} 6 day 1842

this 24 hours strong winds from the N^W East ship heading N^W by W
so ends in the lat ^{N^W} of Longitude ^{West}

Monday Nov ^{the} 7 day 1842

this 24 hours strong wind from the N^W ship heading N^W by W middle and later the
rain in the lat ^{N^W} of Longitude ^{West}

Tuesday Nov ^{the} 8 day 1842

this 24 hours light wind and huplin from all quarters of the compass
so ends in the lat ^{N^W} of Longitude ^{West}

Wednesday Nov ^{the} 9 day 1842

this 24 hours wind light and huplin later light air from the S^W
so ends in the lat ^{N^W} of Longitude ^{West}

Thursday Nov ^{the} 10 day 1842

this 24 light wind from the E. N^W ship heading N^W later the rain
so ends in the lat ^{N^W} of Longitude ^{West}

Friday Nov ^{the} 11 day 1842

this 24 hours light wind and huplin later part calm so ends
in the lat ^{N^W} of Longitude ^{West}

Saturday Nov ^{the} 12 day 1842

this 24 hours begins with light wind middle and later strong wind
from the E S E so ends in the lat ^{N^W} of Longitude ^{West}

Sunday Nov ^{the} 13 day 1842

this 24 hours strong wind from the
S S E ship heading N^W so ends in the lat ^{N^W} of Longitude ^{West}
