Monday November 14 day 1842

this 24 hours strong wind from the ESE later from the S and strong
so ends in the lat N Long West

Tuesday Nov 15 day 1842

this 24 strong wind from the SE at sunset single reef ship heading
Ely later let out the reef and set main top of sail so ends
in the lat N Long West

Wednesday Nov 16 day 1842

this 24 hours strong wind from the ESE ship heading SE so ends
in the lat N Long West

Thursday Nov 17 day 1842

this 24 hours strong wind from the SE to ESE and light
squalls of rain in with top of sails 2 or 3 times 24 hours
Friday Nov 18 day 1842

this 24 hours brisk breeze from the ESE and SE some squalls of rain
in the lat N Long West

Saturday Nov 19 day 1842

this 24 hours strong wind from the ESE later wind from the SE on
cloud down and double reef ship heading SE so ends
in the lat N Long West

Sunday Nov 20 day 1842

this 24 hours strong breeze from the E middle tack ship to the
SE later part let out the reef and set main top of sail
in the lat N Long West

Monday Nov 21 day 1842

this 24 hours strong winds from the E by N ship heading SE by S
so ends in the lat N Long West

Tuesday Nov 22 day 1842

this 24 strong wind from the ESE middle tack ship heading N by E
in the lat N Long West

Wednesday Nov 23 day 1842

this 24 hours strong wind from the S and E middle and later
the same lat Long Thursday Nov 24

this 24 hours more moderate ship up SE to SE so ends the day
in the latitude N Longitude West

Sandwich Islands to Cape St Lucas
Friday Nov 25 day 1842

this 24 light winds from the SE later wind SE course East so ends
in the lat N Long West

Saturday Nov 26 day 1842

this 24 hours began with a fine breeze from the West attended with
fog and rain and steering suits land 2 boats and 4 blackfish
got none later wind light and mood pleasant so ends this 24 hours
in the lat N Long West

Sunday Nov 27 day 1842

this 24 hours light wind from the NW steering E by S in fine weather
in the lat N Long West

Monday Nov 28 day 1842

this 24 hours in flood covering the meet steering E by S wind light
in the lat N Long West

Tuesday Nov 29 day 1842

this 24 light wind from the NW in foggy in fine weather south meet
later wind from the NW steering E by S so ends this 24 hours
in the lat N Long West

Wednesday Nov 30 day 1842

this 24 fine breeze from the NW middle and later wind strong and foggy
in the lat N Long West

Thursday Dec 1 day 1842

this 24 strong wind from the NW steering E by S later wind SE by E
so ends in the lat N Long West

Friday December 2 day 1842

this 24 strong wind from the NW steering E by S saw nothing so ends
in the lat N Long West

Saturday Dec 3 day 1842

this 24 hours fine breeze from the NW steering ESE in fine morning
the mainsail on fine and pleasant lat N Long West

Sunday Dec 4 day 1842

this 24 hours fine wind from the NW steering E by S later part
past the Island of Gaudilook middle and later fine
and pleasant so ends this 24 hours
in the lat N Long West
