Tuesday Dec 6 day 1842

this 24 hours fine breeze from the N.W. steering E.S.E. middle run equally

later pleasant Sat N. Gang West

Wednesday Dec 7 day 1842

this 24 hours fine breeze from the N.W. steering S.W. & later wind

held to the North Sat N. Gang West

Thursday Dec 8 day 1842

this 24 hours fine wind from the N.W. at sunset in all sail

at daylight made all sail in flood mending fouze topsail

in Sat N. Gang West

Friday Dec 9 day 1842

this 24 hours light wind from the N.W. steering in for the Cape

at daylight the land in sight standing a long shore so ends

in Sat N. Gang West

Saturday Dec 10 day 1842

this 24 hours light wind and pleasant weather at 4 P.M. land and coast

a blackfish later part the Captain went on shore in a boat

and returned and sent him and mine and tobacco on shore and

boat of a bullock and a boat load of wood at 11

Sunday Dec 11 day 1842

this 24 hours wind freshen saw a ship and a plenty humpbacks

at night shortened sail in Sat N. Gang West

Monday Dec 12 day 1842

this 24 hours light wind and fresh later strong breeze saw 2

ship and humpbacks and blackfish so ends

in Sat N. Gang West

Tuesday Dec 13 day 1842

this 24 fine weather all hand in flood setting up rigging

saw nothing Sat North Gang West

Wednesday Dec 14 day 1842

this 24 hours fine breeze trying to get up the gulph men

Sat N. Gang West

Thursday Dec 15 day 1842

this 24 a fine breeze from the N.W. at 4 P.M. took ship heading

N.W. double reefed thick and overcast so ends this 24 hours

in Sat N. Gang West

Friday Dec 16 day 1842

this 24 all the day trying to get up the gulph and so forth

Saturday Dec 17 day 1842

all this 24 hours beating in the mouth of the gulph

Sunday Dec 18 day 1842

this 24 hours strong wind later let the reef out and set mizzen

in Sat N. Gang West

Monday Dec 19 day 1842

this 24 hours strong wind a blowing down the gulph at

12 found it in favorable to gain up the gulph and

squard the yards and steered for the Mariners Islands

in Sat N. Gang West

Tuesday Dec 20 day 1842

this 24 hours fine wind from the N.W. steering S.W. later

in flood pulling the fore rigging so ends this 24 hours

in Sat N. Gang West

Wednesday Dec 21 day 1842

this 24 hours fine breeze from the N.W. sunset head

to the wind and by then the night at 6 P.M. land & boats

and went a shore after wood on the Southmost Island

at 2 P.M. came a board and steered S.W. down the coast

in Sat N. Gang West

Thursday Dec 22 day 1842

this 24 a fine breeze steering S.W. a long shore saw nothing

so ends this 24 hours
