Friday Decth 23 day 1842

this 24 hours fine trade from the N.E. steering S.E.
boat 3 reach in flood fitting rigging the Captain in flood mending
performs a boat in the Sat N. Langy 147

Saturday Decth 24 day 1842

this 24 light trade middle and later mended steering S.E.
much in flood ship's duty so end this 24 hours
in Sat N. Langy 147

Sunday Decth 25 day 1842

this 24 light wind and calms middle and later the same
in the Latitude N. Langy 147

Monday Decth 26 day 1842

this 24 hours begin with calms middle a breeze from the
S.E. later part from all parts of compass and heavy
squalls of wind and rain attended with heavy thunder
and lightning ship under short sail so end the day
in the Sat North Langy 147

Tuesday Decth 27 day 1842

this 24 hours begins with heavy squalls of thunder
and rain a very heavy tempest thru the night later
more pleasant Sat N. Langy 147

Wednesday Decth 28 day 1842

this 24 hours fine and pleasant trying to get to the east
in Sat N. Langy 147

Thursday Decth 29 day 1842

all this 24 hours light wind from the N.E. steering S.E.
so end this 24 hours Sat N. Langy 147

Friday Decth 30 day 1842

all this 24 hours light wind from the N.E. steering S.E.
in the Sat N. Langy 147

Saturday Decth 31 day 1842

this 24 hours light wind from the S.E. ship heading
W.S.W. so end this 24 hours

this 24 hours fine breeze from the S.E. middle and later the same
in the Sat N. Langy 147

Monday January 2nd day 1843

this 24 hours light breeze from the E ship heading S.E.
middle and later much the same all play air no work
in the Sat N. Langy 147

Tuesday Jan 3rd day 1843

this 24 hours light wind from the E.S.E. end fine and pleasant
in the Sat N. Langy 147

Wednesday Jan 4th day 1843

this 24 hours light wind and pleasant weather same nothing
in Sat N. Langy 147

Thursday January 5th day 1843

this 24 hours fine breeze from the N.E. steering S.E. middle
and later strong wind Sat N. Langy 147

Friday Jan 6th day 1843

this 24 hours begins strong wind and squally weather from the
N.E. at 6 P.M. look in the light sails ship heading S.E. and
S.E. middle heavy squalls double reef later more pleasant
made all sail ship heading S.W. so end this 24 hours
in the Sat N. Langy 147

Saturday Jan 7th day 1843

this 24 hours begins with a light breeze from the S.E. middle
and later light and hazy so end this 24 hours
in Sat N. Langy 147

Sunday Jan 8th day 1843

this 24 hours light air from the E.S.E. later calm so end
in the Sat N. Langy 147

Monday Jan 9th day 1843

this 24 hours first part wind from N.E. S.E. middle
and later rain S.W. and thick and rainy so end
in the Latitude North Langy 147
