this 24 hours light winds standing to the N and E
middle and later the sun Lat 01.12 S Long 119.40 West

Sunday Feb 19 day 1843

this 24 hours fine trade and pleasant weather at 3 PM spoke
the Bark Northern of Taubman 30 months out
1050 lbs at sunset saw a school of sperm whales
to later to later middle fine and pleasant later standing to the S

Lat 00.12 m S Long 119.36 West

Monday Feb 20 day 1843

this 24 hours light winds from the SE took ship 2 or 3 times

this 24 hours and saw 2 sail saw few fish mends

Lat 00.37 m S Long 119.40 West

Tuesday Feb 21 day 1843

this 24 hours fine trade later steering NW saw a ship
to the leeward in place mending the mainsail saw
finlocks in the Lat 1.17 S Long 119.40 West

Wednesday Feb 22 day 1843

this 24 hours pleasant weather first steering NW at
sunset left to the SE at 9 PM spoke the
Bark Martier and garden end fine and pleasant

in the Lat 00.13 m S Long 119.40 West

Thursday Feb 23 day 1843

this 24 hours fine winds and pl weather steering NW at

5 PM saw sperm whales land didn't come off

with them going quick to the windward middle and later
fine and pleasant Lat 00.30 S Long 121.55 West

Friday Feb 24 day 1843

this 24 hours light winds and pl weather standing to the SW

this day took the Parker pinch James Synteh neck

saw a Bark Lat 00.18 m S Long 121.55 West

Saturday Feb 25 day 1843

this 24 hours light winds and pleasant weather from the SE

Ship heading to the S at 12 PM saw a Bark in sight

Lat 00.37 m S Long 124.20 West

Since in the year of our Lord 1843

Sunday Feb 26 day 1843

this 24 hours fine wind and pleasant weather at sunset a Bark
in sight later light signals of rain at 12 noon ship
to the N. ends Lat 01.46 S Long 125.26 West

Monday Feb 27 day 1843

this 24 hours strong trade steering N saw nothing so ends

in the Lat 00.28 m S Long 125.48 West

Tuesday Feb 28 day 1843

this 24 hours fine winds and pleasant weather steering

N West Lat 00.37 m S Long 125.48 West

Wednesday March 1 day 1843

this 24 hours fine wind and pleasant weather at 6 PM spoke

the Ship Waresan of N B 19 months out 800 lbs

later part spoke saw a gain and gain and fine and pleasant

Lat 00.40 m North Long 125.48 West

Thursday March 2 day 1843

this 24 hours fine weather saw finlock and a ship in sight

standing to the SE at 12 PM this 24 hours so ends

in the Lat 00.20 m S Long 128.19 West

Friday March 3 day 1843

this 24 hours light winds at sunset a ship in sight

to the windward later strong trade saw this 24 hours

in Lat 01.41 S Long 128.19 West

Saturday March 4 day 1843

this 24 hours fine trade later part saw ship and stood NW

in the Lat 02.20 S Long by looner 130.35 West

Sunday March 5 day 1843

all this 24 hours fine wind and pleasant weather steering NW

a finlock Lat 01.12 S Long by looner 131.30 West

Monday March 6 day 1843

all this 24 hours fine wind and pleasant weather later part

in place mending the mainsail saw blackfish saw

saw a sail in the Lat 01.18 S Long 132.22 West

steering NW for the sand neck Islands
