Friday April 28 day 1843

this 24 hours strong winds from the N.E. steering S.W.
Sat 24.31 N Long 176.13 East

Saturday April 29 day 1843

this 24 fine winds from the N.E. steering N.W. at sunset
in mainsail at daylight sat it again saw nothing
in the Sat 26.19 N Long 174.06 East

Sunday April 30 day 1843

this 24 hours fine winds and pl weather from the N.W.
steering N.W. at sunset sheeted sail at daylight
made all sail and steered N.W. by l Sat 28.11 N Long 173.27 East

Monday April 1 May 1 day 1843

this 24 hours light winds from the E.S.E. steering N.W. by l
later part light winds and pleasant weather
in flood setting up shoals Sat 29.22 N Long 173

Tuesday May 2 day 1843

this 24 hours light winds from the S.E. at sunset
in sail and Commerce standing boats machines etc
daylight made sail and steered N.W. saw nothing
in the Sat 30.40 N Long 172.13 East

Wednesday March 3 day 1843

at sunset in sail at daylight made sail to the S.W.
Sat 30.40 N Long 172.13 East

Thursday May 4 day 1843

all this 24 hours fine winds and pleasant weather from the
South at sunset in sail later made sail saw nothing
Sat 30.50 N Long 171.23 East

Friday May 5 this 24 hours

saw nothing so ends Sat 31.00 no Long

Saturday May 6 this 24 hours wind from
the S.W. at sunset in sail at daylight
made sail Sat 30.41 N Long 170.00

Sunday May 7 this 24 hours fine air
and weather saw penbacks so ends
Sat 29.41

Monday May 8 1843

this 24 hours strong winds from the N.E. at 5 P.M.
spoke ship Debarther of newport 17 m 900
and the ship same well Robertson 17 500 lbs

Sat 29.50 N Long 168.20 East

Tuesday May 9 this 24 hours fine wind and weather

saw nothing Sat 30.39 N Long 168.00 East

Wednesday May 10 this 24 hours fine wind took

ship & this 24 hours Sat 31.00 N Long 168.00 East

Thursday May 11 this 24 hours sun rain

saw nothing in the Sat 31.25 N Long 168.00 East

Friday May 12 this 24 hours light wind and

saw blackfish in flood fitting rigging so ends
in the Sat 31.00 N Long East

Thursday May 18 this 24 hours mordenit

mind and enters at 5 P.M. spoke the ship S. Robertson
middle and later mordenit saw blackfish
so ends Sat 29.58 N Long 168.37 E
