weather sun blackish at sunset in sail as usual at
day light made sail Lat 31 04 Long 167 25 East

Tuesday ^{the} 22 this 24 hours strong wind sun
grampuses Lat 29 25 Long 168, 10 East

Wednesday ^{the} 23 this 24 hours strong wind
sun a shout in flood making span yarn to end

Thursday ^{the} 24 all this 24 hours fine breeze and
pleasant weather Lat 30 20 Long 167 50

Friday May ^{the} 25 this 24 hours fresh breeze
and pleasant weather Lat 30, 8 Long 168

Saturday ^{the} 26 this 24 hours strong
wind ship under short sail Lat 28 14

Sunday ^{the} 27 this 24 hours began
with strong winds at 2 P.M. in all sail heavy wind

and the rain at sunset more pleasant later fine
and pleasant at 11 A.M. saw a ship Lat 28 45 Long 168 00

Monday ^{the} 28 this 24 hours light wind
and pleasant at sunset in sail later part strong

wind saw a ship so end Lat 30, 12 Long 167 30

Tuesday ^{the} 29 this 24 hours began
with strong wind at 4 P.M. in sail signal of rain and

fog later part strong wind and pleasant
Lat 29, 56 Long 168, 05 East

Wednesday May ^{the} 30 this 24 hours
strong wind and pleasant no saw finbacks

Lat 29, 57 Long 168 Wednesday this
24 hours strong wind ship under short sail

Lat 30 00 Long 168, 22 East

on Ship May 1 1843

Thursday June 1 day 1843

first part in four topsail at sunset in all sail at day
light more pleasant made sail saw a finback so end

Lat 31 08 Long 168, 26 East Friday June 2 day 1843

at 12 saw a large sperm whale and board 4 boats
saw nothing more of him he was going quick to the N

Lat 31 5 middle and later strong wind Lat 31 00 Long

Long 168 26 Saturday 3 this 24 hours strong wind

Ship under short sail middle and later lying to
under close reef main topsail blowing strong

Lat 31 20 Long East

Sunday June 4 day 1843

first part strong gales and rainy weather lying to
under close reef in topsail later part midnight made

sail Lat 31 25 North

Monday June 5 day 1843

this 24 hours began with light winds and rainy foggy
weather middle and later the same so end

Tuesday ^{the} 6 this 24 hours most part
foggy later part saw a ship to the windward

and more pleasant Lat 30 35 Long 168 40 East

Wednesday ^{the} 7 this 24 hours fine pl
weather later part saw a ship to the windward

in the Lat 30, 58 Long 168, 05 East

Thursday ^{the} 8 this 24 hours light wind
and pleasant weather Lat 30, 50 Long East

Friday ^{the} 9 this 24 hours fine wind from
the SSW to the SSE Lat 30 35 Long

Saturday ^{the} 10 this 24 hours fine wind and
pleasant weather later part saw 4 ships

standing to the East so end Long 30 00 Lat 168 39

Sunday ^{the} 11 this 24 hours fine
wind and pl weather from the S saw

5 ships this 24 hours so end
Lat 29 51 Long 166, 09 East
