

Remarks on Japan in July 1843

Thursday July 20th day in

this 24 hours in place blowing down oil in the fore hatch
later strong wind saw 3 ships Lat 30.43 Long 167.16 East

Friday 21st this 24 hours strong wind from
the S & later part the same saw one ship so end

Lat 29.44 Long 167.14 East
Saturday 22nd this 24 hours strong wind

from the East saw 1 ship Lat 29.46 Long 166.50
Sunday 23rd this 24 hours strong wind and smoky weather

from the E ship under short sail all this 24 hours saw 3 ships
Lat 30.18 Long 166.31 E

Monday 24th this 24 hours strong
wind and pleasant weather saw 8 or 9 ships so end

Lat 30.59 Long 166.30
Tuesday 25th this 24 hours fine weather

at 4 P.M. spoke the ship Adeline Gibbs
22 months 1100 bbls later saw 5 ships so end

Lat 30.22 Long 166.45 East
Wednesday 26th this 24 hours fine pleasant

weather saw 5 ships Lat 29.42 Long 167.28
Thursday 27th this 24 hours fine weather saw 2 ships

and fishbacks and grasshoppers Lat 30.14 Long 167.45 East
Friday 28th this 24 hours moderate wind and pleasant

weather saw 2 ships so end Lat 30.48 Long 168.02
Saturday 29th this 24 hours moderate wind and pleasant

weather saw 5 ships and a cargo Lat 30.48
Sunday 30th this 24 hours fine weather later part

light squalls of rain saw 2 ships Lat 30.28 Long 168.14 E
Monday July 31st the last day 1843

this 24 hours fine weather saw 3 or 4 ships at sunset
shortened sail and have all three this morning

wind mostly from the S and E
Lat 31.02 Long 168.38 E

Tuesday August 1st day 1843

first part spoke 2 ships the "Harrison" 1100, 24 m
and Elvira starbuck 400 bbls 20 months later

Lat 31.22 Long 169.45 East
Wednesday 2nd this 24 hours fine weather and pl. weather

saw 4 ships 1 bayling Lat 31.20 Long 169.55 East
Thursday 3rd this 24 hours fine weather

from the S & saw 1 ship later strong wind so end
Lat 30.29 Long 169.42 East

Friday 4th this 24 hours strong wind from
the S & later part rainy ship under short sail saw

1 ship Lat 31.25 Long 170.00
Saturday 5th this 24 hours strong wind

from the S & E and thick rainy weather ship under close
sails saw a ship to the leeward Lat 31.25

Sunday 6th this 24 hours strong wind
and overcast weather from the S & later more

moderate Lat 31.12 Long 168.00
Monday 7th this 24 hours strong wind

and smoky weather later part squalls of rain wind S
Lat 30.54 Long 168.28 East

Tuesday 8th this 24 hours strong wind
and smoky weather saw a ship to the S and E

Lat 31.11 Wednesday 9th this 24 hours
more pleasant saw blackfish Lat 30.30 Long 169.51

Thursday 10th this 24 hours strong
wind and squally weather saw 1 ship so end

Lat 30.46
Friday 11th this 24 hours began

with strong wind and squally weather at
sunset spoke the ship Elvira off

Salem later strong wind from the S & E
steering E by S at sunset in sail we

lift to the wind to the S & E
Lat 30.33 - 169.51 East
