July 26<sup>th</sup> Aunt Mary Ann has been here all day to day  
July 27<sup>th</sup> Nothing unusual has occurred. I have worked all day  
July 28<sup>th</sup> There was a mistake piece in the paper about the Mon.  
Kinnon today. Eliza & me went up to night  
July 28<sup>th</sup> I went to Elder Morton's this morning & to Elder Howes  
this afternoon, & to the Unitarian this evening. I had a letter  
July 30<sup>th</sup> I have run up to Grandmother's this forenoon. Mother  
went home in the bank this forenoon, she is coming back  
to-morrow.  
July 31<sup>th</sup> Mother came back to day. She brought her dresses  
down home to me a pair of shoes. They were pretty well down  
then. Mr. Eldridge had a bad cold & his boy had a fever.  
Julia Crocker was very sick with inflammation of the bowels.  
August 1<sup>st</sup> The colored people were going to have their celebration  
today if it had not rained. They are going to have their  
to-night & turn out to-morrow if it is pleasant.  
August 2<sup>nd</sup> It was pleasant my business out & had a quite in  
Parker's Grocer's went in the afternoon with Mother & Aunt Lucy.  
There was a great many things there appeared to have a nice time.  
August 3<sup>rd</sup> Today is fast day. There was some meetings in town  
but we was hurried with work & did not go.  
August 4<sup>th</sup> I have worked all day to-day. Mother & Aunt  
Lucy stay & we went down to the children's line.  
I'm going to the fair next Saturday night if nothing happens.  
I went to the Grace Church this morning and to  
Elder Howes this afternoon.  
Aug 6<sup>th</sup> Went up with Eliza this forenoon  
1<sup>st</sup> 2<sup>nd</sup> 3<sup>rd</sup> 4<sup>th</sup> 5<sup>th</sup> 6<sup>th</sup> 7<sup>th</sup> 8<sup>th</sup> 9<sup>th</sup> 10<sup>th</sup> 11<sup>th</sup> Nothing unusual has occurred

August 12<sup>th</sup> I went to Elder Morton's this forenoon. It rained hard  
the rest of the day till 6 o'clock, so I did not go anywhere  
Aug 13<sup>th</sup> I went up to Grandmother's this forenoon & spent the forenoon  
and afternoon Elder Morton. On Mr. Eldridge & his brother from Braintree  
called here. Mr. Eldridge brought me a letter from Minerva & one from  
Frank Rogers that had been in the office some time. The Montezuma come  
Aug 14<sup>th</sup> Aunt Lucy, Eliza, Aunt Mother and me went up to Arnold's  
residence this afternoon. It looked very pretty up there.  
Aug 15<sup>th</sup> Uncle Jacob has been gone 1 year to day & they have not been up to  
see that went up to Grandmother's & spent the day to day. I went up at 6 o'clock  
and she went to her brother's & spent the day to day. Aunt Elizabeth & me  
Aug 16<sup>th</sup> Aunt Lucy, Mother, Mrs. Sears, Eliza Ann, May & me went down to the  
Poor House this afternoon. There was 1 very sick woman there. It looked real  
Aug 17<sup>th</sup> Eliza Ann, May & me went down to Eliza's a little while this evening.  
Aug 18<sup>th</sup> I was not much hurried in the shop to day. Mother & me spent the forenoon  
Aug 19<sup>th</sup> Mother has been gone a month to day. I went to Elder Howes this forenoon  
& to Elder Morton's this afternoon. Mr. Eldridge preached to Elder Morton's  
to day. Stayed at home in the evening.  
Aug 20<sup>th</sup> Mother & Aunt Lucy have washed & ironed to day.  
Aug 21<sup>st</sup> Nothing unusual has occurred to day. Mrs. Duane  
Aug 22<sup>nd</sup> Mother, Aunt Lucy & May have to stay here to day  
to spend the day to Uncle Samuel's sister Sally's  
Aug 23<sup>rd</sup> One of the Engine Company's & a company  
Kridgewater have turned out to day. Mrs. Howes bought  
Mrs. Howes had a boy to day. Julia Crocker died to day.  
Mrs. Howes died to day. He had 15¢ gold & 1.25  
Aug 24<sup>th</sup> Mrs. Howes & her husband's sister were here  
to dinner to day.  
Aug 25<sup>th</sup> Aunt Lucy is 32 to day. The Providence Boat  
come here on an excursion to day. Mrs. Howes  
came & got left by Sarah Howes was married to Henry  
Lacelles last week. He belongs in New York they are there.  
Aug 26<sup>th</sup> I went to Elder Howes all day to day.  
Aug 27<sup>th</sup> Worked all day. to-day as we was in a hurry.  
Aug 28<sup>th</sup> We all went to Elder Morton's vestry this evening to a Temperance  
meeting. I had a letter from Jack to day.  
Aug 29<sup>th</sup> Mr. Macomber & Mrs. Howes went to Providence this afternoon  
to get married. He finished his wedding suit today. It was very  
pretty. All my family went down to spend the day to day. It rained
