Sarah & Ellen & her sister had their Daguerres taken this afternoon. Mrs And told my fortune this morning. She said I should have a short, handsome fellow. He would not be very well off then I married him but we should grow quite rich. George Cannon & Ben have been gone a good while.
September 1st. The den got home to night. Last night I watched with Aunt Lucy to John Eldridges.

September 2nd. This forenoon I went to Elder Mortons & this afternoon to Elder Howes. I went to Grandmother's to tea & to Elder Mortons in the evening.
September 3rd. Nothing uncommon has occurred to-day.

September 4th. We all went up to the Washington Hall to night to a lecture on Temperance. It was first rate. The lecturer was Rev. Mr Martin of New York. He is a son of Temperance.
September 5th. Uncle Sam Rivington has been dead 2 years to-day. Mother and Aunt Lucy are going to watching to night.

September 6th. Mother & Aunt Lucy watched with Mrs Bonny last night and I slept with Eliza Ann.
September 7th. We have got lots of work to-day in the shop. Mother, Eliza & me went up to Mrs Bonneys this eve a little while.
September 8th. I finished my trade last night. All of our family but me went to the Catholic meeting this forenoon. I went to Elder Mortons. I went to Elder Howes in the afternoon & went with Sarah up to see Aunt Lydia to tea. Then we went to Elder Mortons in the evening.

September 10th. Mother & Aunt Lucy have washed & ironed today.
September 11th. I went up to David May's & spent the day today. Sarah & Emma come up this morning. I will be with them till the cart went out. Then we went to school. I & Eliza went to South Bridge street.

September 12th. Last night Sarah, Eliza & Lydia & Rogers went into Mr Claves store and Sarah had quite a talk with him about the singing school. This morning he bowed to Lydia, Eliza and I went to Grandmother's to spend the day today and we called in there when we went up & bought something & he followed us to the door & asked us to call again.

September 13th. John Abbott invited all his children up there to dine and I heard they all went. This evening we have all been over to Eliza's. Mr Bradford, Parker & I finished 83 dresses to day. I went with his father. Charles & I and Sarah & I come down.

September 30th. Mother and Aunt Lucy have been to Mrs Sears this afternoon and evening. This eve I have been up to Benjamins. Eliza has been up to Sarah Lucis. Sarah & her beans come home with her. Benjamins and Cyrus come with me. Mrs Bonny come with me. Aunt Lucy has got to finish a vest to day. Eliza has had company from Cuttunk. They went home to day. Mrs Bonny told me all night last night.

December 2nd. I have been to Mortons all day. Cyrus & Benjamins are there in the evening. I have got quite sore lips to day.
December 3rd. Our folks have washed to day but it rains so that they cannot dry their clothes. We had the first snow that we have had last night but the rain has carried it off. My lips are no better.

December 4th. Eliza and I spent this afternoon & evening to Susan Adams. Mother is finishing her chair cushion. It has not cleared off yet.

December 5th. Aunt Lucy hung out her clothes but it commenced raining so she had to take them in again. The Bethel singers & a number of others went down to Mattapoisett & had a ball last night. They had a dark stormy time I guess. Uncle Sammel's pork come today. Eliza Ann is sick abed with the sick headache. Benjamins come down this eve & stayed on board a day.

December 6th. This forenoon I went up street & got some mail. I had a letter from Aunt Edwidge to day.

Dec 7th. This afternoon and eve I have been down to Eliza. Charles brought Mother and me a pair of buck-brushes to make in a pair of trousers. I have a shilling a pair & Benjamins
