Dec. 24th. Mother and Aunt Lucy have washed to-day. They
did not hang them out because it snowed and rained.
Dec. 25th. To-day is Christmas. Eliza and Caroline are up
here spending the day. I had a letter from Minerva this
morning. I answered it this afternoon and carried it
up to the Office. It is a dreadful cold out. Pardon Jones
gave Eliza a real pretty box to-night for a Christmas present.
Dec. 26th. It is a beautiful day to-day but it is very cold.
Miss Sears has been up to Mrs. Birds to-day to spend the day.
Dr. Fleming called to-day. He had some Gold dust that
a Mr. Thayer brought home. He arrived this morning.
Dec. 27th. I have been up to the Office to-day to carry a
letter for Father. Mrs. Richards's funeral was to-day. They are
going to carry her to Concord tomorrow. This evening I have
been over to Aunt Eliza's. Charles brought Aunt Lucy a vest to-
night. Dec. 28th has been a beautiful day to-day. Eliza & her
baby and husband have been over here part of this afternoon.
He had a fire over to Forest Point in Marchant
this morning. I eat dinner to Mrs. Birds to-day. She

Dec. 29th. Nothing uncommon has occurred to-day.

Jan. 5th. I have got such a cold that I have not been out much
to-day. Anna has been up here this afternoon & Hatty. Anna staid the
evening and all night. I am to Aunt Mary Ann's. Aunt Hannah
Spomer come down to-day from Head of the River.
Jan. 6th. It is a beautiful day. I did not go to meeting this
forenoon but Mary went. He staid at home in the afternoon
with Aunt Mary Ann and I went. I did not go out to the well
because I had got cold. The first in the afternoon was he can

mother is washing a little to-day. I am going to sleep with Hatty
to-night. Jesse as to Hatty to-night. He has been to Bradford to-
day. Dec. 8th it rained this morning. I got home from Hatty's a little
past 8. I put up my things and about 1/2 past 9 we started for
home. Aunt Hannah come up with us. The stage was crowded.
Lizzie White come up with us & staid to Eunice's.
Jan. 9th. I went to the Office & got a letter from Randolph to-day.
I went with Eliza to buy in a calico dress. It was 10 cts a yard. She
had 10 yds. The old went up to the Union meeting to-night. Mrs.
Marble had a son to-night. Eliza Sears was here to-night. She
is Elizabeth Bonney's birthday to-day. She is 16 yrs old.
Jan. 10th. I went up to the Office to carry a letter for Father & sent
after Dr. Fleming to come to Eliza's house. She is not so well. I went
into Eunice's a little while. Mrs. Bonney come down & spent to-
day & evening to-day. Eliza & Aunt & baby was here in the evening.
