May 16th I went to Carole to night after school. Mother came

great stranger indeed.

May 17th It was a beautiful morning this morning.
Mother went to Mrs. Clarissa Meigs this afternoon to
quitting. She came home about 7 & went to meeting.
Elizabeth White & Enock & Louisa were here this eve & staid
till 1/2 past nine. Father had been gone 4 weeks to-day.

May 18th There has been an auction to-day down to Little Whites.
They sold about everything & bought back what they wanted. They
sold that back coat 500 B's & they sold it to Marshall Jones
for 21 dollars. Lot Jones bought their carriage. Isaac Barrons
bought a mattress that cost 17 dollars for 10. They sold 12

May 19th Mother has been to Aunt
Laura this afternoon to spend the

afternoon. To night Sarah came up here & I went home with
her & saw Emeline Worthington and she paid me that 9

no mistake. Sarah's cousin (John Smith) come down to-day
to Uncle Andrews. He is Aunt Art's nephew. Yesterday

May 21st Mother has washed & taken up her carpet to-
day. Sarah came up here this afternoon & spent the afternoon

Amy took another boarder to-night. Uncle
Samuel's brother, Mr. Thomas Eldridge. Uncle I had
been sick ever since last Sunday. The sore in
his throat broke to night & he is better.
