these 24 hours begins with moderate breeze from the NW & cloudy weather
at 8 PM starting & watch employed in ships duty firing for whaling & the various kinds of
work on board at sun down shortened sail & made all ready for the day
light winds from the NW & fine weather at 8 AM made sail watch
employed in ships duty saw one whaling big sturn steering to the NW
bore into 30 the day was fair weather sturn East saw one school of porpoises
Left in 4 of 35.52 N Long in 4 of 117.20 West

18 Remarks on Friday August 15th 1851

these 24 hours begins with a light breeze from the NW & cloudy weather
at 8 PM watch employed in ships duty broke out the blubber room after heavy weathering
bore into 30 & making boat marks & at 2 PM saw a jumper some squally to the NW
have some rain showers at sun down last rapid breeze & variable & squally by spells
at 8 AM saw a strong sail bearing SE from us sailing watch employed in ships duty
bore into 30 various kinds of work at 10 the wind bore from NW & made sail & sturn
by the wind to the SE the day was fine weather
Left in 4 of 36.05 N Long in 4 of 117.05 West

19 Remarks on Saturday August 16th 1851

these 24 hours begins with a fine breeze from the NW & smooth weather
at 8 PM starting by the wind to the SE watch employed in ships duty at sun down
shortened sail & made all ready for the day fine breeze from the South &
at 8 AM smooth weather at 3 AM made sail & sturn & SE watch employed in
bore into 30 ships duty at 9 AM spoke the ship by the name of new before cast
arrived 18 days out 70 tons sturn & went on board & bought 2 gallons of oil
at 9 PM got came on board & sturn & SE watch employed in ships duty
a fine breeze sturn East Left in 4 of 35.45 N Long in 4 of 115.13 West

20 Remarks on Sunday August 17th 1851

these 24 hours begins with a fine breeze from the South & smooth weather
at 3 PM starting East watch employed in ships duty various kinds of work on board
bore into 30 at sun down shortened sail & sturn by the wind bearing SE & made
Left in 4 of 35.11 N Long in 4 of 117.17 West

21 Remarks on Monday August 18th 1851

these 24 hours begins with a fine breeze from the NW & smooth weather
at 8 PM under all necessary sail steering SE saw jumps at sun down shortened
bore into 30 sail & sturn by the wind to the SE made all ready for the day
breeze from the NW & smooth weather at 8 AM made sail & sturn by the wind
to the SE watch employed in ships duty at 8 AM bore into after black fish
at 8 AM with two boats could not get fast came on board at 10 the ship to
bore into 30 the NW & SE watch employed in ships duty at 10 the ship to
to the SE again so once this day fine weather
Left in 4 of 34.37 N Long in 4 of 111.09 West

22 Remarks on Tuesday August 19th 1851

these 24 hours begins with a fine breeze from the NW & smooth weather under all
at 8 PM necessary sail steering by the wind to the SE watch employed in ships duty
bore into 30 various kinds of work on board making boat sails & carpentering & at sun
down shortened sail & made all ready for the day moderate breeze & fine
at 8 AM weather at 8 AM made sail watch employed in ships duty the day was
bore into 30 with fine pleasant weather sturn & SE
Left in 4 of 33.33 N Long in 4 of 110.22 West

23 Remarks on Wednesday August 20th 1851

these 24 hours begins with light winds from the NW & fine weather
at 8 PM pleasant weather steering SE watch employed in various kinds of work
bore into 30 bore into 30 saw a small black bearing SE & SE from us sturn for it
at 8 PM saw a strong sail bearing SE & SE from us at sun down
shortened sail & sturn by the wind to the North & made all ready for the day
at 8 AM light breeze & calm at 8 AM made sail bearing to the NW by the wind
one large & one big in sight steering to the eastward at 8 AM saw a large
at 8 AM school of black fish bore into 3 boats & bore into all the forenoon could not get
fast at 11 past 11 came on board & sturn by the wind bearing East & SE & bore
so once this day fine weather two strong sails in sight
Left in 4 of 33.26 N Long in 4 of 110.22 West
