

24 Remarks on Thursday August 21st 1851

these 24 hours begins with a fine breeze from NNE & fine weather
at 6 P.M. under all sail steering by the wind heading East watch employed in ships
barometer 30¹/₁₀ duty various kinds of work on board finished all our best provisions
two strong sails in sight at 4 P.M. leave after black fish could not get
part of sun down came on board & took in sail & headed to the Eastward
at 6 A.M. middle & latter part of the day light breeze from North & fine weather at 5
barometer 30¹/₁₀ made sail at 2 commenced setting up the fore rigging at 10
tacked ship to the NW by 8 set up the larboard side & main
topmast shrouds several merchant vessels in sight at midday
raised 5 sperm whales 4 miles off our weather beam going to
the SW so much this day light breeze from North & fine weather
Left in 4th of 33.13 N Long in 3rd of 39.00 West

25 Remarks on Friday August 22nd 1851

these 24 hours begins with light breeze from North & calm
at 6 P.M. fine smooth weather several strong merchant barges in
barometer 30¹/₁₀ sight at 1 P.M. leave for sperm whales could not get
part of sun down came on board & took in sail heading
to the NW by light breeze & fine weather whales going SW
at 6 A.M. when first seen from the ship middle & latter part of the day light
barometer 30¹/₁₀ breeze at 5 A.M. made sail & steered by the wind heading from North
to NW by the wind from the westward several sails in sight at 2 P.M.
broke out the after hole after hours at 11 commenced raining the day
wind thick weather no sail to day

26 Remarks on Saturday August 23rd 1851

these 24 hours begins with moderate breeze from the NE & cloudy
at 6 P.M. weather watch employed in ships duty various kinds of work on board
barometer 30¹/₁₀ several strong sails in sight at 2 P.M. midday were ship & stand
by the wind heading from E to SE at sun down shortened sail middle
at 6 A.M. & latter part of the day light breeze from North & calm &
barometer 30¹/₁₀ rain squalls watch employed in ships duty several strong sails in
sight at 11 A.M. made all sail & steering by the wind to the NW
at midday tacked ship to the E by so much this day
Left in 4th of 33.12 N Long in 3rd of 39.15 West

27 Remarks on Sunday August 24th 1851

these 24 hours begins with light breeze from North & calm & passing
at 6 P.M. rain squalls steering by the wind to the NE watch employed in ships
barometer 30 duty various kinds of work on board finished all our best provisions
made a canvas draw bucket several strong sails in sight at 6 P.M.
capt cook from the brig Samuel Cook of Providence came on board
at 6 A.M. 6 months out chain he gave me some black fish oil to burn at 2
barometer 30 to mi stewards had several convulsion fits at 4 P.M. came out of
them one shot in the side capt work went on board passing squalls of
rain through the night latter part of the day fine weather & light breeze
made all sail & steered NE by E plenty of vessels in sight at 4 A.M.
the wind backed SW the day ends fine weather
Left in 4th of 34.00 N Long in 3rd of 37.54 West

28 Remarks on Monday August 25th 1851

these 24 hours begins with light winds from NW & fine weather
at 6 P.M. under all sail steering NE several sails in sight at sun down
barometer 30¹/₁₀ shortened sail & steered by the wind to the NW by middle & latter
part of the day moderate breeze from NW a few passing showers
at 6 A.M. of rain at 5 A.M. made sail & steered NE watch employed in ships
barometer 30¹/₁₀ duty various kinds of work on board saw one merchant ship steering to
the NE this day ends fine weather
Left in 4th of 34.48 N Long in 3rd of 37.46 West

29 Remarks on Tuesday August 26th 1851

these 24 hours begins with a fine breeze from NW & fine weather
at 6 P.M. steering NE watch employed in ships duty one merchant ship in sight
barometer 30 at 3 P.M. we had a rain squall at sun down shortened sail & steered
by the wind to the NW by middle & latter part of the day moderate breeze
from the NW by fine weather at 6 A.M. made sail & steered NE by E at
6 A.M. to have a rain squall until 7 A.M. & then cleared off watch employed in various
barometer 30¹/₁₀ kinds of work on board one strong hie in sight steering to the NW & the day
ends fine weather steered NE by E
Left in 4th of 35.53 N Long in 3rd of 37.25 West
