board 30% two strong sails in sight at 8 A.M. commenced turning up the fore

at 5 P.M. there 20 hours lying with moderate breeze from S.W. & fine weather steering in 2 two sails in sight watch empty, & in turning up the fore shrouds & topmasts backstays etc. & part 4 finished them at 5 bound 2 boats after blackfish could not get part at sun down came on board & shortened sail & stowed by the wind to the west at 12 M. was ship to the S.W. & latter part of the day moderate breeze from S.W. & fine weather at 5 A.M. made sail & stood E.N.E. & commenced turning up the main shrouds 2 strong sail in sight at 8 bound one boat after blackfish at 9 bound again could not get part the day ended with a fine breeze from S.W. & stand East
