

71 Remarks on Tuesday October 7th 1851

there 24 hours begins with a fine breeze from NNE & rainy weather
at 8 P.M. steering by the wind to the S W & N W B saw one big at 2 P.M. the
baromet. 29.27 here beached to the E & E & faint at 3 P.M. calm inside & latter part
of the day light airs & variable all round the compass steering S E & when
at 8 A.M. we had any breeze fine pleasant weather. watch employ. in ship duty
baromet. 29.27 at 10 A.M. res. tools to the fore sail one big in sight & soon this day
left in 7.09 9.17 M long in 7 chronomet. 21.17 west

72 Remarks on Wednesday October 8th 1851

there 24 hours begins with light airs of wind from W to E & calm
at 8 P.M. & pleasant weather steering S E & watch employ. in ship duty one big in
baromet. 29.27 sight steering to the south at 8 P.M. we took a squall of rain & a
light breeze at 9 P.M. calm at 11 the wind beared from W to steered to the
south latter part of the day fine breeze from south to W to steering by
at 8 A.M. the wind to the S E & being squalls by shells two sails in sight
baromet. 29.27 the day ends with fair weather & a fine breeze from S W
left in 7.04 8.34 M long in 7 chronomet. 21.25 west

73 Remarks on Thursday October 9th 1851

there 24 hours begins with a fine breeze from S B W & cloudy weather
at 8 P.M. steering by the wind to the S E & S E B & watch employ. in ship duty one
baromet. 29.27 sail off our weather beam & one was sailed out of sight a storm inside &
latter part of the day light winds from W to N W & fine weather
at 8 A.M. under all sail steering by the wind heading from S E B & to south &
baromet. 29.27 sails in sight & one whaling barque a haw we cut sail & them all
at 8 A.M. Joseph Thacher & Charles willard got to fighting & I made them
fight each other with each of them a piece of small iron line & I gave
them 6 fishes a piece with the same kind of line watch employ. in sailing
over our potatoes & onions the day ends with light winds & fine weather
coming up with a whaling barque fast a haw
left in 7.04 7.50 M long in 7 chronomet. 18.28 west

74 Remarks on Friday October 10th 1851

there 24 hours begins with light winds from S W B & fine pleasant weather
at 8 P.M. steering by the wind to the S E & watch employ. in sailing over our potatoes at 2 P.M.
baromet. 29.27 there a plenty of vessels in sight one whaling barque at 8 P.M. exchanged
signals with a whaling barque I suppose to be the Mass about of
Mottoporett at 8 we steered W to the wind from West at 10 P.M.
at 8 A.M. it hailed round to the south at 8 A.M. it hailed back west at 7
baromet. 29.27 a thick rain storm light winds coming from S E to S W B & taking
ship several times at 9 we clear saw 4 sails the day ends cloudy
left in 7 account 8.110 M long in 7 chronomet. 18.15 west

75 Remarks on Saturday October 11th 1851

there 24 hours begins with moderate winds from South to S W & thick
at 8 P.M. weather break out the fore hole after watered pump for two each & filled
baromet. 29.27 one with salt water & the other we put our oil in at 3 P.M. set in to
rain haw at 8 P.M. took in light sails inside & latter part of the
day thick rainy weather by shells steering by the wind heading from
at 8 A.M. S B & to S E B at 7 A.M. took a ship & haw from W to N to W to
baromet. 29.27 at 11 saw 3 strong sails one big & two barques at midnight the moon
black ship to main to port halyard parted & come down on deck
the day ends thick weather left in 7 account 8.50 M long & account 17.15 west

76 Remarks on Sunday October 12th 1851

there 24 hours begins with thick weather & raining by shells 3 sails in sight
at 8 P.M. at 1 P.M. took a ship & haw S B & wind from S W to a red ship
baromet. 29.27 to our summer block & put it up a jar inside & latter part of the day
moderate breeze from W to N to South & passing rain squalls by shells
taking ship back & forth from W to E & 8 strong sails in sight the day
at 8 A.M. ends light winds from South heading W to N
baromet. 29.27 left in 7.04 5.34 M long in 7 chronomet. 18.45 west

77 Remarks on Monday October 13th 1851

there 24 hours begins with light winds from South to S W & rain squalls hanging
at 8 P.M. round heading to the westward 5 sails in sight at 5 the wind beared from S W to
baromet. 29.27 steered S W at 10 calm at 5 A.M. the wind beared from S W to S E &
sails in sight at 9 saw a whole of 20 times to the land that in thick rainy weather
at 8 A.M. by the main to port block 1.30 M the wind S W & had west & haw to the fore
baromet. 29.27 the day ends thick & rainy left in 7 account 8.10 M long & same 18.50 west
