there 24 hours begins with a fine breeze from N.E. & fine weather
at 6 P.M. steering N.W. watch employed in stripping scrubble trees middle &
baromet 29.22 latter part of the day moderate breeze & fine weather at 6 A.M.
at 6 A.M. steers N.W. watch employed in ships duty the day once with fine weather
baromet 29.22 Sett in by day 14.56 South long in by chronomet 34.20 west

90 Remarks on Sunday October 26th 1851

at 6 P.M. there 24 hours begins with moderate breeze & fine weather steering N.W.
baromet 29.22 watch employed in ships duty at 2 P.M. saw a ship bound to the north
at 4 P.M. were on board four large cotton trees & straggling sails & put them
in rack at 6 began to rain thick weather at 6 double reefed topsails &
at 6 A.M. stored short watches at 8 P.M. the wind shifted to the south strong breeze
baromet 29.22 equally & rainy latter part of the day strong breeze from N.E. & ruggid sea
on & equally by shifts at 2 A.M. were ship to the N.W. at 11 A.M. saw
a strong sail off our lee beam the day once equally weather
Sett in by account 15.30 South long in by the same 30.50 west

91 Remarks on Monday October 27th 1851

there 24 hours begins with strong breeze from N.E. & ruggid sea on & equally
at 6 P.M. by shifts steering by the wind to the N.W. under double reef topsails at 8 P.M.
baromet 29.22 fresh fair sail & last reefed the topsails & were ship & hoisted up 8 P.M. strong
breeze & ruggid sea on latter part of the day fresh breeze from N.E. & fair
at 6 A.M. weather at 6 A.M. were ship & set all necessary sail & hoisted N.W. to one
strong sail in sight stunn at 9 we turned up the ladder on shore boat
to fit her for watching the day once with fresh breeze & fair weather
Sett in by day 15.31 South long in by chronomet 35.20 west

92 Remarks on Tuesday October 28th 1851

there 24 hours begins with a fresh breeze from N.E. & fair weather steering
at 6 P.M. the wind under double reef topsails 9 A.M. & hoisted N.W. to one
baromet 29.22 watch employed in ships duty fitting the overhead boat for watching & other various
kinds of work one strong sail stunn steering by the wind to the N.W. at 6 P.M.
were ship to the eastward & last reefed the topsails the strong vessel took
ship off our lee beam in the evening & we were ship to keep clear of him
at 9 P.M. were ship & hoisted East middle & latter part of the day fresh
baromet 29.22 breeze & ruggid at 6 A.M. were ship to the N.W. & made all necessary sail
watch employed in ships duty water making a horn search the day once fair
weather Sett in by day 15.54 South long in by chronomet 36.00 west

sail off our lee bow at our own shortland sail & were ship & hoisted
East middle & latter part of the day more moderate at 6 A.M. were ship
at 6 A.M. to the N.W. & made sail watch employed in ships duty at 10 saw small boats
baromet 29.22 saw one finback at 4 past 11 set main top gall sail & main sail the day
once with a fine breeze & good weather
Sett in by day 16.18 South long in by chronomet 36.22 west

94 Remarks on Thursday October 30th 1851

at 6 P.M. there 24 hours begins with a fine breeze & fair weather steering by the wind
baromet 29.22 N.W. to one watch employed in ships duty at 2 P.M. saw a strong sail to windward
at our own shortland sail & were ship to the eastward latter part of the day equally by shifts
at 6 A.M. at 6 A.M. were ship to the N.W. & made all necessary sail watch employed in ships duty at midday took a look
baromet 29.22 at noon the day Sett in by account 16.30 South long in by chronomet 36.32 west
