three 24 hours begins with a fresh breeze from N.E. & cloudy weather  
at 6 P.M. steering by the wind to the Eastward watch employed in ship's duty (sailing)  
baromet 29.75 in mid. water finished the barnis work at sun down shortened sail middle  
& latter part of the day equally & rainy at 3 A.M. were ship to the N.E. to  
at 10 A.M. cleared up the wind shifted round to the N.E. & light winds  
at 6 A.M. watch employed in washing there close the day new fair weather & a light  
baromet 29.75 here from 8 A.M. then 11 hours more this day  
Set in by log 16.41 South Long in by chronomet. 36.50 west

96 Remarks Saturday November 1<sup>st</sup> 1851  
three 24 hours begins with a light breeze from E. & E. & fair weather  
at 6 P.M. steering N.W. watch employed in washing & mending there close at 3 P.M.  
baromet 29.75 nearly calm at 4 past 3 P.M. saw a large whale 4 points off our  
weather bow bearing N.E. from us & going about 8 P.M. at 4 past 4  
boreward 3 boats & pulled to the windward its being equally to the  
windward & rainy saw nothing more of the whale at dusk in the  
evening came on board & shortened sail & headed N.E. with a  
at 6 A.M. light breeze from East middle & latter part of the day fine breeze from E. & E.  
baromet 29.75 & fine weather but some smoky at 4 past 3 A.M. were ship to the North  
at 6 made all sail watch employed in ship's duty saw two strong sails at  
10 A.M. tacked ship to the N.E. the day new fine weather  
Set in by log 16.47 South Long in by chronomet. 36.53 west

97 Remarks on Sunday November 2<sup>nd</sup> 1851  
three 24 hours begins with a fine breeze from E. & E. & fine weather but some  
at 6 P.M. smoky steering by the wind to the N.E. watch employed in ship's duty 3 strong  
baromet 29.75 sails in sight at 3 P.M. a strong whale ship stood up from our bow  
bow & were ship off our bow & stem by the wind as we are steering  
at sun down shortened sail middle & latter part of the day light winds  
at 6 A.M. from E. & E. & fine weather at 6 A.M. were ship to the N.E. & made  
baromet 29.75 all sail saw 2 merchant vessels the day new light winds tacked ship  
to the N.E. Set in by log 17.06 South Long in by chronomet. 36.30 west

98 Remarks on Monday November 3<sup>rd</sup> 1851  
three 24 hours begins with light breeze from East to E. & E. steering by the wind  
at 6 P.M. to the N.E. one strong sail off our bow steering to the N.E. at sun down  
baromet 29.75 shortened sail at 11 P.M. were ship to the North latter part of the day moderate  
breeze & fine weather at 6 A.M. made all sail several sails in sight some whale  
at 6 A.M. & some merchant vessels at 8 broke out the main & topmast & pump 250 lbs  
baromet 29.75 fresh water at midday tacked ship to the N.E. so new this day  
Set in by log 15.39 South Long in by chronomet. 36.42 west

99 Remarks on Tuesday November 4<sup>th</sup> 1851  
three 24 hours begins with light winds from E. & E. & fine weather steering  
at 6 P.M. by the wind to the N.E. watch employed in starting water & filling with salt  
baromet 29.75 water at sun down shortened sail middle & latter part of the day moderate  
ate breeze & fine weather at 6 A.M. made all sail two sails in sight  
at 7 stem South on bent the fore topmast staysail & took one cloth out  
at 4 past 8 saw a large hunch bearing N.E. from us at 4 past 9 saw  
whale a shorting at 2 past 10 boreward for them & a goshawk long  
at 6 A.M. man in to them & frightened them we came on board whale going  
baromet 29.75 N.E. & E. two barges off our bow steering to the North by the wind  
the day new of chasing whales  
Set in by chronomet 17.35 South Long in by the same 36.11 west

100 Remarks on Wednesday November 5<sup>th</sup> 1851  
three 24 hours begins with fine weather of chasing whales two  
at 6 P.M. whaling barges in sight at 4 past 1 came on board & got dinner  
baromet 29.75 at 4 past 2 boreward three boats & the whale going down for the other  
ships & the boreward for the whale but could not get fast at 5 P.M.  
mi. boats came on board at 6 I went on board of the A. R. Tucker  
capt. being 4 months 40 lbs & the other barges was Aerial 300 lbs  
& Hellen's now when at 10 came on board & stood to the N.E. under  
at 6 A.M. short sail at 4 past 11 were ship middle & latter part of the day moderate breeze  
baromet 29.75 & fine weather at 6 A.M. made all sail & stem by the wind heading from N.E. to  
at 8 past 11 the A. R. Tucker off our bow steering the same watch employed in ship's  
cuty fitted the fore topmast staysail & bent it on the stay at 10 tacked ship to the  
N.E. the day new fine weather  
Set in by log 17.25 South Long in by chronomet. 36.00 west
