

109 Remarks on Friday November 14th 1851

Three 24 hours begins with a fine breeze from NW & fine weather
at 6 P.M. under all sail steering by the wind & watch employed in
board 29th the ships duty, plating masts & other various kinds of work on board
at 3 P.M. saw small white weather off weather low we took it to
be a whale got the boats ready saw nothing more of it at 5 tooted
ship to the Eastward at sun down shot down sail latter part of the day
at 6 A.M. fresh breeze & spicing down at 6 A.M. were ship to the NW & made
board 29th all masonry soil two soils in sight watch employed in washing &
manning there close at 10 set all sail more moderate at midnoon
tooted ship to the Eastward one whale ship off our lee beam
left in by day 16.32 South Long in by chronometer 30.36 West

110 Remarks on Saturday November 15th 1851

Three 24 hours begins with a fine breeze from NW & spicing
at 6 P.M. down under all sail steering by the wind to the Eastward watch
board 29th employed in washing & manning there close one whale ship to the
leeward steering to the NW by the wind at sun down shot down sail mizzen
& latter part of the day fine breeze & fine weather at 3 P.M. were ship
at 6 A.M. to the NW at 8 made sail one sail in sight watch employed in ship
board 29th the duty set up the mizzen to masts back step the day cool fine weather nothing in sight
left in by day 18.32 South Long in by chronometer 36.30 West

111 Remarks on Sunday November 16th 1851

Three 24 hours begins with a fine breeze from NW & fine weather
at 6 P.M. steering by the wind to the NW & watch employed in plating masts &
board 29th other various kinds of work on board at 3 P.M. steered South saw a
whale ship to the leeward at sun down shot down sail & steered by the wind to
the NE mizzen & latter part of the day fine breeze & fine weather at 6 A.M.
were ship to the NW & made all sail at 8 saw a whale ship to the leeward
at 6 A.M. & one barque to windward at 10 tooted ship to the NE the barque running
board 29th the down to us at midnoon an English barque spoke us capt Bonny 74 months
out 60 lbs we steered NE so once this day fine weather
left in by day 18.37 South Long in by chronometer 36.10 West

112 Remarks on Monday November 17th 1851

Three 24 hours begins with a fine breeze from NW & fine weather
at 6 P.M. steering NE one ship & barque in sight at sun down shot down sail &
board 29th went on board of the Kellen once at 9 came on board & steered to the NE by the
wind mizzen & latter part of the day moderate breeze & fine weather at 5 A.M.
were ship to the NW & made all sail several sails in sight at 9 steered NE
watch employed in ships duty at midnoon the barque A. De Pucher spoke us
at 6 A.M. soon she steered to the NW by the wind & we steered NE so once this day
board 29th left in by day 17.11 South Long in by chronometer 36.36 West

113 Remarks on Tuesday November 18th 1851

Three 24 hours begins with moderate breeze from NW & fine weather
at 6 P.M. steering NE watch employed in ships duty 2 soils in sight at 11 past 2 steered
board 29th East by the wind at sun down shot down sail mizzen calm at 3 A.M. the wind
blew from NE at 8 made sail & steered NE by the wind 5 soils in sight
at 6 A.M. moderate breeze watch employed in ships duty at midnoon tooted ship to the East
board 29th left in by day 17.34 South Long in by chronometer 36.20 West

114 Remarks on Wednesday November 19th 1851

Three 24 hours begins with light air of wind from NE & fine weather
at 6 P.M. having to the Eastward by the wind watch employed in ships duty several
board 29th soils in sight at 5 P.M. the Barque Victory of Dartmouth spoke us
bound to Rio de Janeiro I sent mi boat a long side & got some papers
at sun down shot down sail mizzen & latter part of the day light breeze & mizzen
calm by spells at 12 were ship to the NW at 5 made sail 2 merchant vessels
at 6 A.M. in sight ship & barque watch employed in ships duty the day cool fine weather & mizzen calm
board 29th left in by day 17.25 South Long in by chronometer 36.18 West

115 Remarks on Thursday November 20th 1851

Three 24 hours begins mizzen calm & pleasant weather having to the NW
at 6 P.M. 11 sails in sight at 2 P.M. bound down the boat & secured off the house
board 29th at sun down tooted ship to the Eastward & shot down sail mizzen part
of the day squally & rainy by spells latter part fair weather at 6 A.M.
were ship to the NW & made all sail watch employed in plating masts
at 6 A.M. cooper employed in making 6 oak blocks a plenty of vessels in sight at
board 29th 11 took a squall of wind & rain the day once fair weather
left in by day 17.02 South Long in by chronometer 36.50 West
