There 24 hours begins with a fine breeze from the North & at 6 P.M. Sunday weather steering by the wind to the NW & watch employed
at 6 P.M. in ships duty plating sinnet & other various kinds of work on board
at 6 A.M. several seals in sight at 8 P.M. the barque Elisha Dunbar
sailed to the westward steering to the Eastward by the wind at 11 P.M. tacked
Ship at sun down shot and sail made & latter part of the day fresh
breeze & cloudy weather at 8 A.M. were ship to the NW & made sail
at 6 A.M. one english whaling barque to the westward steering to the NW
at 6 P.M. several seals in sight at 10 A.M. were tacked ship to the Eastward watch
employed in washing there during the day was the same 2 seals in sight
Sailed in 7th of 17.00 South Long in 7 chronomet. 36.36 West

117 Remarks on Saturday November 22nd 1851

There 24 hours begins with a fresh breeze from NW & cloudy weather
at 5 P.M. steering by the wind to the Eastward under double reef topsails courses & full
at 2 P.M. saw school of porpoise at 3 A.M. the Elisha Dunbar &
I went on board & we both steered to the NW at sun down shot and
sail at 8 came on board & steered to the Eastward latter part of the day
at 6 A.M. fresh breeze & cloudy weather at 8 A.M. were ship to the NW & made sail
at 6 P.M. several seals in sight at 10 A.M. at midday steered NE several seals at 2
Sailed in 7th of 16.49 South Long in 7 chronomet. 36.37 West

118 Remarks on Sunday November 23rd 1851

There 24 hours begins with fine breeze from NW & sunny weather
at 6 P.M. steering by the wind to the NW & watch employed in plating sinnet & painting the iron
at 6 P.M. in side at 2 steered by the wind & B.L. at sun down shot and sail
made & latter part of the day fine breeze & fine weather at 6 A.M.
were ship to the NW & made sail several seals in sight one whale
at 6 A.M. ship & one barque & several merchant vessels they were the same
at 6 P.M. fine weather tacked ship to the E.B.L. by the wind
Sailed in 7th of 16.50 South Long in 7 chronomet. 36.10 West

119 Remarks on Monday November 24th 1851

There 24 hours begins with a fine breeze from NW & fine weather
at 6 P.M. steering by the wind to the Eastward several seals in sight merchant vessel &
at 6 P.M. in side at 5 P.M. Mr. & Mrs. Devell went up out of the cabin with
one loaded musket & two loaded pistols & killed William Luke & Robert
at 7 James Spence steered aback & put them in iron on suspension of tacking
ing aback & leaving the ship with a number of the crew with them
& made a place in the after hole & put them down there at sun down
set the watch & stored hole watches lower up to Perseus lower to land
the two prisoners middle part of the day strong breeze & equally by shells
at 6 A.M. took in sail to double reef topsails latter part more moderate breeze
at 6 P.M. all necessary sail steering by the wind bearing E & E.B.L. nothing in sight
at midday James Spence began to have fits took him on deck & took
off his iron & kept him from hurting himself so was the day fair weather
Sailed in 7th of 17.26 South Long in 7 chronomet. 34.07 West

120 Remarks on Tuesday November 25th 1851

There 24 hours begins with a fine breeze from NW & fair weather
at 6 P.M. under all necessary sail steering by the wind bearing from E to E.B.L.
at 6 P.M. watch employed in taking care of the James Spence in fits & William
Luke is in the after hole intended to make a way with himself at
3 P.M. James Spence came out of his fits & William Luke
acknowledged to me before William West & Robert that himself
Jill & Robert with David with Joseph Thacker & John Williams
intended to steal a boat & leave the ship in the night at 11 P.M. we
took James Spence down the cabin & took care of him he had some more of his
fits when we put a rag on his head he wanted to be bound up to make
at 6 A.M. it feel better after that he wanted water to drink & had out him in a fit
at 6 P.M. soon came out of it a gun in the night he had one more fit middle &
at 6 P.M. latter part of the day fine weather with moderate breeze from NW & E.B.L.
at 7 A.M. tacked ship to the NW & watch employed in plating sinnet
& painting the iron work inside one strong seal in sight to leeward the day
ends with fine weather
Sailed in 7th of 17.22 South Long in 7 chronomet. 33.07 West
