

128 Remarks on Wednesday December 3rd 1851

There 24 hours begins with a fine breeze from East & fine weather
at 6 PM steering by the wind bearing over & watch employed in ships duty about the
baromet 29th ship William Luke in iron at 1 PM stand at 6 E at 4 past 3 PM
saw a large whale off our lee beam going S. B. E. at 4 1/2 before 5
bowed the two loaded boats at 4 1/2 before 6 the whale came on top
of water bowed the starboard boat & got fast to the whale to the
starboard boat & the head iron came out & the shaft work got
cut off & the whale got clear of us could not get fast a gun
at 6 AM at 7 came on board & stand at 6 E & wind & latter part of the day
baromet 29th moderate breeze & fine weather at 5 at 4 PM stand at 10 several seals
in sight watch employed in ships duty they were fine weather stand at 10
left in 4 09 33.33 South long in 7 chronometer 34.46 west

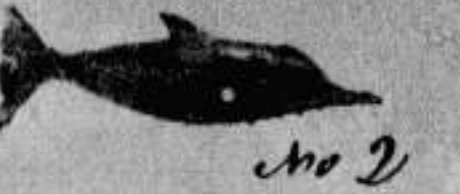
129 Remarks on Thursday December 4th 1851

There 24 hours begins with a moderate breeze from East & fine
at 6 PM weather steering over for Pernambuco several seals in sight watch
baromet 29th employed in ships duty William Luke in iron at 4 past 5 PM
saw Cape Augusten bearing W. by N. at sun down shortened sail
& stand by the wind to the S. E. at 1 PM tacked ship & stand by the
at 5 AM to the north latter part of the day light wind & fine weather at 5
baromet 29th at 4 PM made sail & stand in to the north for Pernambuco at 10 saw
the city of Pernambuco they were fine weather nearly up with
the town of Pernambuco

130 Remarks on Friday December 5th 1851

There 24 hours begins with moderate breeze & fine weather
at 6 PM lying off & on at Pernambuco at 1 PM I went on shore & then
baromet 29th went the boat back brought James M. house & William Luke
& then things on shore & delivered them up to the captain at 7 PM
I came on board & stood to the N. E. under easy sail at sunrise
at 6 AM a Brazilian man of war boat came on board at 8 AM I
baromet 29th went on shore to Pernambuco to settle up my affairs on shore
the day was fine weather lying off & on at Pernambuco

131 Remarks on Saturday December 6th 1851



There 24 hours begins with fine weather lying off & on at Pernambuco
at 6 PM at 4 past 5 PM came on board with 25 or 30 sardines & one 100 lbs. fish
baromet 29th at 4 past 5 PM took up the boat & hauled forward bound back to the alledas banks with
22 men on board all told at 8 PM tacked ship to the N. E. at 2 past 10
tacked to the south & fetched to the windward of Cape Augusten
latter part of the day moderate breeze & fine weather steering south watch employed
at 6 AM in steering the starboard anchor & on board the chains saw several seals caught on
baromet 29th the fore part of the day was with fine weather stand at 10
left in 4 09 4.15 South long in 7 chronometer 34.52 west

132 Remarks on Sunday December 7th 1851

There 24 hours begins with moderate breeze from East & fine weather
at 6 PM steering S. B. M. watch employed in steering down our chains & other various
baromet 29th kinds of work on board our one strong sail macle & latter part of the day
fine breeze & fine weather at 6 PM stand south at 6 AM stand at 10
at 6 AM seals in sight at 11 AM spoke the barque Lapthe of Neuchaport 40 months
baromet 29th out 1250 lbs. sperm & 1000 humpback oil bound some cast quishman
came on board I sent him 200 lbs. bread & 30 lbs. tobacco the day was fine
weather lying at anchor in company with the sapphire
left in 4 09 11.15 South long in 7 chronometer 35.01 west

133 Remarks on Monday December 8th 1851

There 24 hours begins with a fine breeze from East & fine weather lying at anchor
at 6 PM in company with the barque sapphire at 3 PM cast quishman went on
baromet 29th board & stand by the wind to the north & was stand at 10 m macle & latter part
of the day fine breeze from East to East & fine weather steering S. B. M. watch
at 6 AM employed in ships duty saw several seals the day was with fine weather
baromet 29th left in 4 09 13.17 South long in 7 chronometer 35.30 west

134 Remarks on Tuesday December 9th 1851

There 24 hours begins with a fine breeze from East & fine weather steering S. B. M.
at 6 PM watch employed in setting up the boats & lower part rising macle & latter part
baromet 29th of the day fine breeze & fine weather steering S. B. M. watch employed about
the ship cleaned the spades & with 2 the cutting falls in the after hole saw one
at 6 AM English telegraph schooner steering by the wind to the Eastward the day was
baromet 29th fine weather
left in 4 09 15.20 South long in 7 chronometer 35.01 west
