Then 24 Hours begins with moderate breeze from ESE & fine weather
at 6 P.M. weather clearing N.W. watch employed on board in ships duty at sun
down shortened sail & stood boats were watched stand 1 B.M.
middle & latter part of the day light winds & fine weather at 5 A.M.
at 6 A.M. made sail & stood N.W. watch employed in ships duty the day ends with
breeze 29 2/3 light winds set in 7 of 16.35 South long in 7 chronometer 36.15 west

136 Remarks on Thursday December 11th 1851

Then 24 Hours begins with moderate breeze from ESE & fine weather
at 6 P.M. standing N.W. watch employed about the ship at sun down shortened sail
breeze 29 2/3 & stood by the wind to the N.E. & middle & latter part of the day
moderate breeze from East & fine weather at 5 A.M. made all sail
standing by the wind to the N.E. & some sail in sight at 8 the big latitudes
of Baltimore spoke us at 11 we spoke the brig Mexico east of us
at 6 A.M. came on board the day more fine weather
breeze 29 2/3 set in 7 of 17.20 South long in 7 chronometer 36.09 west

137 Remarks on Friday December 12th 1851

Then 24 Hours begins with light winds & fine weather standing
at 6 P.M. West galling with the Mexico several sails in sight at sun down
breeze 29 2/3 shortened sail & stood by the wind to the South at 9 P.M. caught
Whitons went on board at 6 A.M. was ship & made all sail &
breeze up N.E. & E. Mexico & nantucket schooner in sight at 8 stood
at 6 A.M. N.W. watch employed in washing there clear at 11 saw a black
breeze 29 2/3 leaving N.W. watch for the day more fine weather.
set in 7 of 17.20 South long in 7 chronometer 36.20 West

138 Remarks on Saturday December 13th 1851

Then 24 Hours begins with moderate breeze from ESE & fine
at 6 P.M. weather clearing N.W. for a black watch employed in washing there clear
breeze 29 2/3 one strong sail in sight at 4 past 2 P.M. stood by the wind to the N.E.
at sun down shortened sail & were ship to the South latter part of the day
fine breeze & fine weather at 5 A.M. made all sail Mexico & schooner
at 6 A.M. to theeward at 7 A.M. were tacked ship to the N.E. & B.M. watch employed
breeze 29 2/3 in ships duty at 10 exchanged signals with an english barque standing
to the South the day more fine weather tacked ship to the South
set in 7 of 17.20 South long in 7 chronometer 36.27 west

139 Remarks on Sunday December 14th 1851

Then 24 Hours begins with a fine breeze from ESE & fine weather
at 6 P.M. standing to the South by the wind watch employed about the ship one strong
breeze 29 2/3 sail off our lee quarter standing to the South at sun down shortened sail
middle & latter part of the day fine breeze & fine weather at 6 A.M. were ship
to the N.E. at 2 past 5 made all sail standing by the wind to the N.E.
at 6 A.M. the day more with fine weather one sail in sight off our lee quarter
breeze 29 2/3 set in 7 of 17.10 South long in 7 chronometer 36.27 west

140 Remarks on Monday December 15th 1851

Then 24 Hours begins with moderate breeze from ESE & fine weather
at 6 P.M. standing by the wind to the N.E. but one strong sail in sight at sun down
breeze 29 2/3 shortened sail & were ship to the South latter part of the day moderate breeze
from ESE & fine weather at 5 A.M. made all sail & stood by the wind
breeze from N.W. to N.W. watch employed about the ship at 11 saw a sail
at 6 A.M. off our lee beam the day more fine weather
breeze 29 2/3 set in 7 of 17.26 South long in 7 chronometer 36.30 west

141 Remarks on Tuesday December 16th 1851

Then 24 Hours begins with a fine breeze from N.W. & fine weather
at 6 P.M. standing by the wind to the N.W. watch employed in ships duty one sail off our lee beam
breeze 29 2/3 at 5 saw a ship off our lee beam standing to the N.E. at sun down shortened
sail & were ship to the ESE middle part of the day raining by spells
latter part light air of wind from the N.E. & calm 3 strong sails in
sight at 8 A.M. back out the main hole on the starboard side forward
at 5 A.M. & humphreys & each fast water the day more light air of wind from N.W.
breeze 29 2/3 set in 7 of 17.29 South long in 7 chronometer 36.12 west

142 Remarks on Wednesday December 17th 1851

Then 24 Hours begins with light breeze from N.W. & fine weather watch
at 6 P.M. employed in standing off the hole & getting out a bag of butter one whole
breeze 29 2/3 ship off our lee quarter at 2 P.M. the wind shifted round back standing
to the N.W. at 3 finished standing off at 5 calm at sun down shortened sail
at 6 the wind blew up from the N.W. stood to the Eastward latter part
of the day fine breeze from N.W. & clear weather one sail in sight at 4
at 6 A.M. made sail at 2 past 5 A.M. stood 1 B.M. were ship to the South
at 6 A.M. watch employed in ships duty the day more nothing in sight
breeze 29 2/3 set in 7 of 18.12 South long in 7 chronometer 36.23 west
