

1113 Remarks on Thursday December 18th 1851

There 2d Hours begins with fine breeze from the north & cloudy weather steering S B M watch employed in ships duty at 6 P.M. baromet 29.22 set the watch & stored hole watches found in the Arrupe state at 8 star south thick weather & rainy by spells latter part of the day fresh breeze & spells from N B E & thick weather & at 10 P.M. rain at 6 A.M. star S B M at 11 fresh main sail & double baromet 29.22 fresh 2 fore top sail the day more thick & rainy weather. Let in by account 20.10 south Long in by account 35.10 west

1114 Remarks on Friday December 19th 1851

There 2d Hours begins with fresh breeze by spells from the north & rainy weather steering S B M at 1 P.M. took the watch list baromet 29.22 upon the upper mains took in main top gallant sail & double reefed main top sail mizzen & latter part of the day strong winds & very rainy & a heavy sea on at 12 at night saw at 8 A.M. a strange vessel she showed her light steering to the N E baromet 29.22 the day more with strong winds from N B E & a heavy sea on & thick & rainy. Let in by account 23.16 south Long in by account 37.30 west

1115 Remarks on Saturday December 20th 1851

There 2d Hours begins with strong winds from the north & thick rainy weather & a heavy sea on steering S B M at 1 P.M. sent down fore top gallant yard & fore royal yards & put on the upper hatch bars at 1 P.M. last reefed main top sail & freshed fore top sail at 4 past 3 P.M. we came away from the running in to an unknown vessel she was steering by the wind to the S E under main top sail last reefed & fore sail reefed were at 6 A.M. took in our fore sail & luffed to the wind to the S E at 2 A.M. baromet 29.22 it began to moderate at 4 past 4 A.M. we heeled off S B M & made sail the wind hauled round to the N E at 7 A.M. S B M & foggy squally by spells at 8 A.M. we made the most of the day to look out for whales at midnoon turned the reef out the fore top sail & set the spanker set main top gallant sail so once this day fair weather. Let in by 25.29 south Long in by chronometer 35.46 west

1116 Remarks on Sunday December 21st 1851

There 2d Hours begins with a fresh breeze from N B E & passing down steering by the wind hailing S B M at 1 P.M. took in top gallant sail. baromet 29.22 latter part of the day fresh breeze from West to N B E & passing down of foggy & drizzle by spells at 5 A.M. double reefed the topsails the day more fair weather. Let in by 27.23 south Long in by chronometer 37.00 west

1117 Remarks on Monday December 22nd 1851

There 2d Hours begins with fresh breeze from N B E & passing down & ruff sea steering by the wind hailing from S B M at 1 P.M. took in ship & hauled up main top & mizzen mizzen & latter part of the day light winds & fine weather watch employed in lashing the anchors & other various kinds of work on board the day more calm. Let in by 27.30 south Long in by chronometer 37.10 west

1118 Remarks on Tuesday December 23rd 1851

There 2d hours begins with calm weather & fine weather watch employed in ships duty at 4 P.M. a light breeze sprang up from S B E made sail & steered S B M mizzen & latter part of the day moderate breeze & cloudy & overcast weather at 6 A.M. star S B M watch employed in ships duty set up main top gallant sail & other various kinds of work on board saw one large turtle the day more with moderate weather. Let in by 28.02 south Long in by chronometer 38.10 west 38.10

1119 Remarks on Wednesday December 24th 1851

There 2d hours begins with a fine breeze from S E & drizzle & overcast weather steering S B M watch employed in ships duty about the rigging & mizzen parts of the day thick weather foggy & drizzle the wind coming to the N B E at 7 A.M. set all sail at 8 past 8 A.M. the wind hauled S B M & hauled off at 9 saw a strong sail steering to the S E at 8 past 9 we tack ship & hauled N B M saw no more the day more with a fine breeze & fair weather nothing in sight. Let in by 29.06 south Long in by chronometer 40.10 west
