

165 Remarks on Thursday January 8th 1852

Three 24 Hours begins with light breeze & variable mostly from the E & N by night calm & sunny weather & some small rain by spells heading to the South all hands employed in cutting up blubber & boiling & washing the oil ship china in sight at 11 P.M. went out sight to the westward of us at 8 P.M. it shut in thick & began to rain & blew on from E & N to South at 4 past 10 the wind hauled round to the westward & land off made a fire & began to boil latter part of the day fresh breeze from N.W. to S.W. & clear weather steering to the N.W. by the wind under short sail boiling the dinner made all sail came up & steered E & N for home one more ship in sight to leeward steering to the N.W. at 11 miles on our ship & headed ship B.W. so we saw this day
 Let in 709 35.02 South Long in 7 chronometer 117.55 west

166 Remarks on Friday January 9th 1852

Three 24 Hours begins with fresh breeze from S.W. to N.W. & clear weather steering by the wind to the N.W. by the wind under short sail all hands employed in boiling & washing the oil ship china in sight at 11 P.M. went out sight to the westward of us at 8 P.M. it shut in thick & began to rain & blew on from E & N to South at 4 past 10 the wind hauled round to the westward & land off made a fire & began to boil latter part of the day fresh breeze from N.W. to S.W. & clear weather steering to the N.W. by the wind under short sail boiling the dinner made all sail came up & steered E & N for home one more ship in sight to leeward steering to the N.W. at 11 miles on our ship & headed ship B.W. so we saw this day

167 Remarks on Saturday January 10th 1852

Three 24 Hours begins with fresh breeze from the south & fair weather & a heavy swell heaving from the south heading to the westward under short sail & making water & boiling round to the N.E. all hands employed in stowing down oil at 6 P.M. got all down that was wet & left 4 work mules & latter part of the day moderate breeze from E & N & fine weather at 8 A.M. made sail & commenced pumping water & stowing down oil at 8 A.M. all hands employed in stowing down oil the day over with fine weather
 Let in 709 34.57 South Long in 7 chronometer 118.50 west

168 Remarks on Sunday January 11th 1852

Three 24 Hours begins with moderate breeze from E & N & fine weather steering at 8 P.M. all hands employed in pumping fresh water & stowing down oil at 1 P.M. Steered by the wind to the N.E. saw a plenty of porpoise at 6 P.M. got all through stowing down & all the fresh water pumped on the starboard side of the ship at sun down shot and soil for the night made & latter part of the day fine breeze from the N.W. & fine weather at 8 A.M. made sail & steered N.W. by the wind one whaling barque steering off to the westward & one stony sail to westward steering to the Eastward the day over with a fine breeze
 Let in 709 35.03 South Long in 7 chronometer 118.55 west

169 Remarks on Monday January 12th 1852

Three 24 Hours begins with a fine breeze from N.W. & fine weather under all sail steering by the wind to the N.W. by the wind one whaling barque off our lee quarter steering to the westward at 4 past 1 P.M. we saw a school of large whales at 2 lower the two larboard boats & got fast to the larboard boat & 3 lower mi boat & killed the whale at 4 P.M. got the whole fluked a long side & took in sail & broke out the blubber room & got up the cutting Andes the strong barque having the whale to the leeward & the whale came to windward at 6 P.M. we lower the two larboard boats but could not get fast at sun down came on board & set the watch mule & latter part of the day strong breeze & rugged sea on all hands employed in cutting in our whale & a strong barque to the leeward cutting cutting a whale the day over with rugged weather & breeze of the wind from the North Let in 709 35.03 South Long in 7 chronometer 119.25 west

170 Remarks on Tuesday January 13th 1852

Three 24 Hours begins with strong breeze from the North & sunny weather & a rugged sea on all hands employed in cutting in our whale & a strong barque to the leeward cutting in a whale at 3 P.M. we were ship & took the head to the leeward & cut it in at 7 finished cutting & got down the tackle & provisions & got supper & set the watch & stowed 3 mules through the night mule part of the day strong breeze & thick weather & a heavy swell on & rising by spells at 8 A.M. the wind began to moderate & the sea set & set it & made a fine & commenced boiling & stowing down oil & stowing down oil at 8 A.M. all hands employed in stowing down oil the day over with moderate weather from the N.W. & rugged sea on
