at 6 P.M. at 10 P.M. & for sail all hands employed in cutting up junk & boiling at 3 P.M. got all the junk out up & washed off decks inside & latter part of the day fresh breeze from N.W. to N.E. & a rugged sea on heading to the westward
at 6 A.M. under short sail boiling cloudy weather on board a storm steering the same as we are boiling supposed to be the Elisha dumber at 11 we raised a school of large whales made sail they were from the bow heading all courses lower the two larboard boats & got fast to the waist boat & then lower the starboard boat was soon killed the whole the day was rugged sea on off fast to the whole
Lat in 49° 35' 10" South Long in 79° 20' 00" West

There 24 hours begins with fresh breeze from N.W. to N.E. & cloudy weather & a rugged sea on 3 boats off fast to a whole at 4 P.M. we got the whole
at 6 P.M. at 10 P.M. & for sail all hands employed in cutting up junk & boiling at 3 P.M. got all the junk out up & washed off decks inside & latter part of the day fresh breeze from N.W. to N.E. & a rugged sea on heading to the westward
at 6 A.M. under short sail boiling cloudy weather on board a storm steering the same as we are boiling supposed to be the Elisha dumber at 11 we raised a school of large whales made sail they were from the bow heading all courses lower the two larboard boats & got fast to the waist boat & then lower the starboard boat was soon killed the whole the day was rugged sea on off fast to the whole
