whales at sun down came on board & shot them said & steamed by the wind to
the NW. Letter part of the day passed leisurely from 1 P.M. to 11 P.M. & smooth weather

179 Remarks on Thursday January 22^d 1852

These 24 hours begins with fine hours from 12 M to South & smoky
 at 6 P M weather clearing & we watch employed in ships duty except mending the waist
 beam 29³ Pulvat & breaking out the after hole after storm-vice tree & molapies at 3 P M
 stem & deck at 4 past 3 stern. ESE by the wind at 4 finished mending
 the waist beam at 5 M were ship to the 18 M latter part of the day light
 winds from SE & calms & fine weather at 5 M made sail & steered N by E
 at 6 A M watch employed in ships duty various kinds of work making bags for the
 beam 29³ putting provisions & such the saw one piece of dogbit lines & twine the day goes
 with light airs steered N by E & noon under this day
 Sattin by 35.17 South Long by 149.13 west
